


SCOUT RECRUITMENT

Now is the time to recruit new Scouts! Hang Posters and banners, hand out flyers, hold special events, tell your neighbors and friends, send out emails, advertise in the school paper or website, anything you can think of. CREATE EXCITEMENT! If you need help, call your Membership Committee, Commissioner, or DE.

WHY TURN IN **APPLICATIONS?**

It is important to turn in new membership applications to the Council Office within 48 hours of receiving them for the following

- 1. A boy is not a "Scout" until his name is entered in the National database.
- 2. A boy's "Boy's Life" subscription will be delayed.
- 3. If attending Scout meetings or activities, he will not be covered by the MDSC insurance policy.
- 4. For advancement, his tenure requirement could be affected.
- 5. Pack re-charters will not be printed until Fall Recruitment applications for new youth have been turned in to the Council Office for processing. (This does not mean that you cannot turn in applications after the charters have been printed.) There is no need to hold on to the Council copy of the applications. Even if you only have one or two, they need to be turned in. If you won't be able to make it to the office, put them in the U.S. mail or call your D.E. and they will be picked up. Thanks!

TROOP 247 BACKPACKS TO MT. WHITNEY

Troop 247 Scouts and Scouters recently completed a 40-mile, week-long backpacking trek that culminated in reaching the summit of Mt. Whitney—an elevation of 14,496 feet.

They started on the Cottonwood Pass Trailhead and camped at Chicken Spring Lake, Rock Creek Camp grounds, Crabtree Campgrounds and Guitar Lake. One water source halfway through the hike had

dried up due to a dry winter, and they did encounter some light showers and hail.


WEBELOREE
