I understand that the Humane Society of Atlantic County acts as a satellite clinic where New Jersey licensed veterinarians perform reduced cost spay/neuter surgeries to reduce pet overpopulation. I understand the risks involved and that the Humane Society of Atlantic County can not be responsible for medical complications caused by medical conditions either known or unknown. It is my sole responsibility to ensure that my animal is healthy enough to undergo the requested or recommended procedures. In order to reduce the overall costs to the client, exams are not given prior to anesthesia on the day of surgery; however a full physical exam and pre-surgical blood work can be done by scheduling an appointment through our Veterinary Services Department at an additional cost prior to the surgery date. I understand that the clinic is not staffed 24 hours a day, but that someone is in the building from at least 8am to 3pm seven days a week except major holidays. Feral cats are ear tipped to identify them as being altered. Animals with Fleas are treated, at the owner's expense, with a topical flea treatment of our choice. **Dogs that are clinically obese, weigh more than 99 pounds or are of the English Bulldog breed** are no longer done through our Spay Clinic due to increased inherent risks; they can however be done through our on-site Full Service Vet Clinic. Due to potential complications on fetuses, pregnant animals are always aborted during the spay procedure.

It is strongly recommended that dogs be tested for Heartworm Disease and cats be tested for FELV/FIV, which can be done the day of surgery.

I, being responsible for the above animal, have the authority to grant you my consent to operate on my pet and provide the services indicated on the rear of this form. I understand that there are certain risks to anesthesia that could include serious bodily injury or death and these risks are present in any procedure that requires general or intravenous anesthesia. I hereby waive any and all claims against the Humane Society of Atlantic County, its' contracted veterinarians, its' staff and volunteers, for any and all damages which could possibly include death. All complications resulting from treatment administered at the Humane Society of Atlantic County may be treated through our full service veterinary clinic at a reduced rate. **The Humane Society of Atlantic County will not reimburse me for treatments performed at any other veterinary facility under any circumstances.**

Hernia repair, Dewclaw removal, Pyometra and Cryptorchid surgeries will be additional charges and quoted the day of surgery. Prices for products or services not indicated on this form may vary by size, weight, or species and will be quoted upon request. Medical conditions not known or disclosed may increase the amount quoted. We will make every attempt to notify you at the numbers you provide for authorization. If you can not be reached, the surgeon will decide if the procedure is required based on the health of your pet.

Booster vaccines may be needed to provide full protection for your pet. Please follow up with your regular veterinarian or our Vet Clinic for booster vaccines.

If your dog is aggressive or difficult to handle, please leave him/her in the car while you sign in. There is an additional fee charged (\$50 minimum) due to increased anesthetic costs and amount of work needed to ensure safe handling. We will assist you in bringing him/her into the clinic.

Mature male Dogs may benefit from having a scrotal ablation (removal of the scrotal sac) performed while being neutered to reduce the likelihood of post-operative complications. This procedure is strongly recommended for large and highly active male dogs due to increased likelihood of post-operative swelling, bruising, and discomfort.

For your pet's comfort, a pain management injection is given prior to surgery and included in the surgical fee.

Additional fees are charged for any medications being sent home with your pet.
