Research Committee Fund Research through ESCP Research Grants

- 1. ESCP shall (if the financial situation allows) make available every two years a grant of ten thousand euros (10,000.00 €) to fund research projects in the field of clinical pharmacy in Europe.
- 2. The total duration of a project for an ESCP research grant cannot exceed 24 months (including conducting research, analysing data and reporting).
- 3. A call for proposals will be disseminated in the ESCP newsletter and website from the beginning of the year when the grant is awarded.
- 4. Interested parties can submit an application for funding using the ESCP Research Fund application form (appendix 1) until the 30th June of the year of the call. Incomplete forms and forms that exceed the word limit will not be considered.
- 5. Concerning the application for funding the following issues should be taken into consideration:
 - a. Part I:
 - i. The applicant has to be an organisation (e.g. hospital or community pharmacy or university) based in Europe.
 - ii. The project leader has to be an ESCP member.
 - iii. Projects should involve a partnership of at least two European countries.
 - b. Part II:
 - i. A clear description of the proposed project (including timelines) will be incorporated in a letter of agreement to be signed with the applicant if the project is approved.
 - ii. The applicant's ability to attain the objectives set should include a brief description of the applicant (aims, previous and current activities, etc.)
 - iii. Both the CV of the project leader and a provisional project budget should be sent as attachments.
 - iv. If the total provisional budget of the project exceeds 10,000.00 € the applicant body has the responsibility of securing the remaining funding.
 - v. The 10,000.00 € will only be provided if the entire funding of the project is secured.
- 6. Applications will be evaluated by an ESCP commission consisting of:
 - a. Chair of the Research Committee (chair of the commission)
 - b. Two Research Committee members
 - c. Two external academics or researchers from the ESCP membership
- 7. The commission can ask for an external review should it not have the necessary expertise to evaluate an application.
- 8. Members of the commission cannot take part in any project being evaluated and should declare any possible conflict of interest when they join the commission (appendix 2a). Applicants will also be requested to complete a disclosure declaration form when applying for a grant (appendix 2b).
- 9. The commission will use the following criteria to assess applications for funding (appendix 3):
 - a. Novelty of the project
 - b. Clarity of the aims
 - c. Appropriateness of the design and methodology
 - d. Applicant's ability to attain the objectives set

- e. Feasibility in terms of time and budget
- f. Implications for practice
- 10. The application forms will be sent to the commission who will meet to adjudicate a grant, either in person or telephone, in mid September.
- 11. Project leaders will be notified of the commission's decision one month before the annual symposium. The decision will be publicly announced during the annual symposium.
 - a. The project leader has to register for the symposium in order to receive the grant and sign the letter of agreement.
 - b. 50% of the grant will be awarded with the signature of the letter of agreement, while the reminder will be paid after the project has been finished and a full report submitted to the Research Committee.
- 12. ESCP reserves the right not to award the grant should the commission find that none of the proposals are of an acceptable standard according to the criteria mentioned in point 7. The money reserved for the grant will be used in the following year, after launching another call for proposals, as described in point 2.
- 13. Dissemination of results:
 - a. Any presentation or publication of research findings should clearly acknowledge that the project received an ESCP grant.
 - b. Publication of the results in IJCP preferably is encouraged.
 - c. The final report will be made available on the ESCP web site.
 - d. The funded researcher will present the study results on an ESCP conference and will write a contribution for the ESCP Newsletter, outlining the results of the study.
