1. YUKIMI ANNAND SEQUENCE: JOURNEY OF MAKING ACCORDION BOOKS WITH EXPERIMENTAL CALLIGRAPHIC TEXTURES



YUKIMI ANNAND

She has been studying calligraphy over ten years, and her works have been exhibited in the U.S., Japan and Europe. DELICATE TO ROARING

In this workshop, we choose one or two texts and experiment with making expressive pages with original calligraphic marks. We start from creating marks with different writing tools and any found objects. We then design alphabets with those new marks to write our chosen texts in various ways. We examine writing speed, pressure, the directions of strokes, and the relationship between letters for making effective textures. The exercises include layering, movement, tones and use of one or two colors. Basic design layout and composition, and use of line and space in Japanese calligraphy will be discussed

We will assemble selected exercise pieces to construct accordion books, folding screens and/or series of individual pages to present our journey in sequence.



Photo Transfers to fabric will be added to make this a family treasure for many years to come.

Lisa Engelbrecht passionately pursues lettering of all types on all surfaces. She's a lettering artist and instructor in calligraphy, creativity and mixed media. Lisa teaches classes internationally specializing in lettering on fabric, experimental lettering and the creative process. She teaches at collage, quilting and alternative arts conferences nationwide. Her work can be seen in *Cloth Paper Scissors, Somerset Studios* and the prestigious *Letter Arts Review Annual.* She is the author of *Modern Mark Making/Modern Calligraphy* from Quayside. She is interested not only in classical letterforms but also alternative surfaces for lettering including tattoos and current street influences on modern calligraphy.

5. SUSAN LONGEROT ...

EXPLORATIONS OF BOOK STRUCTURES AND SURFACE DESIGN



SUSAN LONGEROT

I am a second generation native Californian. I graduated from Cal State University at Long Beach where I earned a degree in Art, Education and Cultural Anthropology. After graduation, I taught in the Long Beach Unified School District. For the past twenty-five years I have been teaching adult classes in book binding as an artistic expression and surface designing on paper. I am a fickle artist, experimenting with combining calligraphy, painting, photography, journaling and artist books. They all overlap in my artwork. Although I skip from one medium to another, the common denominator is always COLOR. I currently live in Newport Beach with my husband, Keith. We share a studio space in Costa Mesa.








e will create surface designs for all of the decorative paper used in the binding of our book structures. The surface designs will involve negative space design, symbolism, color theory with watercolor and collage and Itajime rice papers which will be used for some of our pages. Three diverse book structures will be explored. The first is a collapsible book/box with hand dyed pages. The second is a hard cover book with exposed spine stitching and beading with pocket pages to hold directions and samples for each type of stitch. The third is a hard page book that is bound on bronze rods with a knotted and beaded spine.



6. SHERRIE LOVLER . . . TAKING FLIGHT: CALLIGRAPHY AS ABSTRACT PAINTING



SHERRIE LOYLER

Sherrie learned calligraphy in high school and continued studies with Hermann Zapf and Dick Beasley influenced her work. She has been teaching for over 30 years, including Northern Arizona University, International Calligraphy Conferences and Ghost Ranch. Her art has been published in The Art & Craft of Hand Lettering, Letter Arts Review Annuals, and many other books and journals. Accepted in both juried and group shows, Sherrie recently had a solo exhibition featuring her paintings inspired by her poems. In this workshop we will learn to use four styles of lettering as doorways to creating abstract paintings that go beyond words and letters to express our creativity. Although this is not a class in which you will learn an alphabet, we will explore the general structures of brush lettering, Roman capitals, Italic and Neuland to discover the essence of each style.

Through a series of exercises we will experience the letters' shapes and spaces, colors and shades of light, to find a personal connection with them. Working with gestures, our senses, and listening for inspiration from our muses, we will discover the images, thoughts and feelings that spontaneously arise within us in relation to each lettering style. We will allow these images to guide the marks we make on the page and follow the expression of these marks to complete works of art and a book that each participant will make.

Lessons on the elements and principles of design, and using color will be woven into the fabric of this workshop, so even those with no formal art training can learn this process of using familiar letter styles as a portal into the exciting world of artistic expression.

7. MASSIMO POLELLO ... ORDER AND CHAOS - ROMAN CAPS




he aim of the first part of the course is to present the Roman letters in their purest forms, their construction, ductus, proportions and spacing, written initially with an ordinary pencil and then with a flat brush. Even at this early stage we might start to realise that the Roman letter's basic shape always depends on fortune -- the time and the moment of writing.

The second part will develop and explore the different ways of executing a freer form of writing -- reaching for the

MASSIMO POLLELO

Massimo is an internationally known Italian calligrapher. Over recent years he has taken part in major competitions of world standing, given workshops and training in calligraphy and displayed his work in collective and solo national and international exhibitions. After studying the traditional calligraphic styles, he geared his personal quest towards the artistic expression of this discipline by creating his own language and an ontologically expressive approach aimed at imparting the culture of calligraphic art in a contemporary idiom.



unexpected, random and fantastic. A form of writing that is driven by instinct, and comes from the "gut," writing that arises from Dionysus' CHAOS, which has apparently no rules. Suggested ways of doing this type of research includes "dripping," writing with your eyes closed or pictorial gestural techniques, but the aim is to encourage every student to develop his/her own technique.

Finally, we will combine capital letters and free writing, Order and Chaos, Apollonian and Dionysian making and binding a book.

8. CARL ROHRS ... WHAT MATTERS MOST (TO THE LOUDMOUTH, ANYWAY)



CARL ROHRS

Carl Rohrs has been a freelance lettering artist and signpainter in Santa Cruz, CA for more than 25 years. He has been teaching lettering and graphic design at Cabrillo College since 1984 and workshops for unsuspecting calligraphy societies around the country and in Canada and Europe for what seems like a long time, and has managed to keep the splashing of ink on students to a minimum.

he two calligraphic techniques that I am drawn to the most lately are a pointed brush using parallel strokes and a flat pen losing contact with the writing surface — relatively simple ideas that seem to have a half-lifetime's worth of discovery and refinement lurking within.

With a flat pen, our focus will be on an ever more delicate sense of the contact between pen and paper, and the control of the bead of ink that is in-between: Using & losing contact with the paper for unusual stroke shape and a controlled ragged line. For pointed brush, it's standard to lay the side of the brush down and head south, but to use the brush in the way it desires in its secret heart is to achieve the feather-shaped beauty of the parallel stroke for graceful shapes that occur absolutely nowhere else in all of calligraphy.

We'll fit these two approaches into the traditional ways of handling both these tools while learning to modulate their use for a more sophisticated appearance for classical calligraphy all the way to screamingly modern calligraphic wilderness.

9. DEANN SINGH ... ILLUMINATION, GILDING AND MANUSCRIPT DESIGN



his class will be for those who want a slow paced experience and still accomplish a finished painted decorated letter with real gold gilding. Manuscript painting is relaxing and rewarding. It's detail oriented and reminds me of coloring in a coloring book. With that said, you can do the simplest techniques or participate at a much deeper level. I will have the letters to trace then paint with gouache or you can design your own letter, grind the paints and make your own ink. You can participate at the level that feels comfortable for you. I will bring many resources for students to use to achieve their design.

I will also show you how to flat gild with an acrylic adhesive, but will bring samples of old techniques. We'll work on pergamenata paper, which looks very similar to vellum and is transparent so it's easy to see through. I'll bring my copy machine so you can size and resize elements to trace. For those who are interested I'll show you some manuscript canons and how to use them for a double page spread.

All levels welcome.

DEANN SINGH

De Ann has been teaching calligraphy since 1981. She has been a calligrapher for the County of Los Angeles and owns and operates a calligraphy and graphic design studio "Designing Letters." She is past president of the SfC and is current Editor of *Calligraph*. She is the originator of Letters California Style. She co-authored, *Hand Lettering: Simple, Creative Styles for Cards, Scrapbooks & More,* and was technical editor for, *Simple Stroke Calligraph* by Marci Donley. Her work can be seen in movies and television including *National Treasure; Book of Secrets* and *Charmed*.


10. JAKE WEIDMANN ... THE FUNDAMENTALS OF FLOURISHING

JAKE WEIDMANN

Jake is a professional artist and penman who lives and works in Denver, Colorado. He received his Master Penman certificate through The International Association of Master Penmen, Engrossers and Teachers of Handwriting in July of 2011. Jake works across numerous mediums in art and calligraphy and is most well known for his use of flourishing and hand lettering in the context of his art pieces. As a Master Penman, He is passionate about further educating others about the history and traditional techniques of this great art form that might flourish for years to come!

his class will cover the foundational elements of off-hand flourishing with the pointed pen. I will lead the class through the basic strokes and techniques of this beautiful art form, which stemmed from script calligraphy. It will progress from he individual strokes to composing them into some of the most beautiful traditional designs like plumes, quills and flourished birds. This is a very fun class that is relaxed and releaved of the rigid curriculum of teaching an alphabet.
