# California High School Honesty Policy



Plagiarism, forgery and falsification of documents are all forms of cheating. Copying from someone else and presenting it as your own work is dishonest. Forging another person's signature on a document or falsifying written or visual evidence is a severe breach of ethics. This can have serious consequences for you and your grade.

#### What constitutes cheating?

- Allowing someone to copy your homework or class work and turn it in as theirs.
- Looking at another person's paper while taking a quiz or test.
- Copying someone's research without giving that person credit.
- Copying from the electronic library sources without giving credit.
- Using material from the Internet without giving credit.
- Doing someone's work for them and letting them take credit for your efforts.
- Forging a signature on any of the Senior Project documents. •
- Using fabricated visual or written evidence as proof of completed fieldwork.

#### What should you do?

- If you are quoting, copying directly from background reading sources, copy the words exactly as they appear on the page and put quotation marks around them. People will then know what words are yours and which belong to an "official source." Then make sure to include a parenthetical citation to identify this source.
- You may read through some material and ask yourself, "What is the main idea of this?" Once you have decided, instead of quoting the material directly, you can paraphrase the material by writing it in your own words, explaining it as you go along. You still have to give the author credit for the information by including a parenthetical citation to identify this source. Whether you are quoting, paraphrasing, or summarizing, failure to give proper credit to the author constitutes plagiarism.
- In your final paper, it is important to list the sources you have used within your paper on the works • cited page. If it is a source you consulted for ideas but did not use in your paper, then that source should appear on a works consulted page.
- In your fieldwork, accurate, honest and reliable reporting of evidence is crucial for the passing • grade. Any forgery or invalid evidence of completion of fieldwork is unacceptable.

#### What will happen if I do not follow this policy?

- The case will go to the steering committee.
- I can get a zero for the assignment.
- I can be denied the opportunity to do the work over.
- I can expect a phone call home from the teacher.
- In the case of a major assignment, it could radically affect my grade.
