The Sparrow Scholarship in Memory of Ted Luttrell

This scholarship was created by the family and friends of Ted Luttrell who was a student at Shoreline Community College until his death from an aneurysm at age 20. A gifted bassist and lyricist, Ted had a passion for music and hoped to complete the audio recording program at SCC despite scholastic and medical challenges. This scholarship is intended to support students who share Ted's gift and passion for music and also face challenges that make attaining their dream more challenging than the norm. The Shoreline Community College Foundation will make available one \$3,000 scholarship to a student seeking a degree or certificate in the SCC Music Technology Program who meet the eligibility criteria.

The award will be for SCC tuition and fees related to tuition, and/or textbooks and required materials available through the SCC Bookstore. The scholarship has no cash exchange value and is non-transferable. The award expires June 2015.

Criteria for Eligibility

- ❖ Applicant must have applied to Shoreline Community College and be seeking a degree or certificate in the SCC Music Technology Program.
- ❖ Applicant must be a Washington state resident (as defined by the College).
- ❖ Applicant must have and maintain a minimum cumulative 2.50 GPA.
- ❖ Financial need will be considered, but is not a requirement.

Application Procedures

To be considered, each applicant must submit **4** copies of the following in collated packets: (Please type)

1. Completed application form
2. Completed Budget Worksheet (attached)
3. Copy of most recent transcripts.
4. Current class schedule (if applicable)
5. A 250-500 word essay describing your dreams and the challenges you face, what you are doing or hope to do to make your dreams a reality, and how these challenges have affected your life in a positive way. If the only effect of the challenges you face so far has been negative, explore how that negativity could possibly be turned around in some way to be of benefit to yourself and the world.
6. Submit documentation by a qualified professional describing the applicant's degree of disability and the challenges faced.
7. Two letters of recommendation from adults who know about your experiences, challenges and potential for success.
8. One letter of recommendation from an adult, who may be related to you, describing why they believe you should be considered for this scholarship (optional).

Scholarship funds will be available for use beginning fall quarter 2014. The funds will be disbursed in three equal installments for fall, winter, and spring quarters. In order to maintain each quarter's disbursement, the student is expected to meet with an advisor or tutor on an ongoing basis throughout each quarter and provide verification of such while also maintaining a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA. If all criteria are met, the student may apply for the subsequent year's award, totaling two academic years of three quarters each.
