INTERNET BAN AGREEMENT

Pictures taken of children in the Widows and Orphans Homes in Ethiopia or any specific information relating to them cannot be posted on the internet. This includes, but is not limited to blogs, list servers, websites, Twitter, all social networking sites, etc. A generic story can be shared, but no pictures, names, ages or place of birth.

You may share pictures and stories of children in the orphanages with your family, friends and church group. We encourage you to share your orphanage experiences personally. Pictures and stories can be shared in digital or written form but not in any way should they be placed on the internet. Do not give material that has pictures and information of the children to anyone to use unless you are assured they will not be posted on the internet.

The Widows and Orphans Homes in Ethiopia and Adoption Ministry of YWAM can be severely affected if pictures of the children entrusted to their care are found on the internet. Please be respectful of the honor and responsibility Adoption Ministry is extending to you by welcoming you to their orphanages.

PROTECT OUR MUSLIM PROJECT

Your mission team may be going to a primarily Muslim village. The Holy Spirit is doing some powerful work in this village and many villagers have converted to Christianity. I am sure you are aware of some militant Muslim factions in Ethiopia and other parts of the world. In order to protect the school and worship center projects as well as the evangelists working there, we respectfully request that anything you post on the internet be censored. **Please do not mention the name of the village, post pictures with names of the evangelists or mention the word "Muslim"**. You certainly can write about the incredible things you will see there, but just be very careful what you post on the internet. Giving out detailed information about the village or the men working in this village could prove detrimental to the safety of our friends in these areas and/or affect the continuation of our project.

LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING

Short Term Missions Trip Adoption Ministry of YWAM-Ethiopia

Ethiopia is a third world country and many things we take for granted here in the United States, Canada or Europe will not be accessible in Ethiopia. Your nightly lodgings will be clean with Western toilet facilities and hot showers. When you are ministering in the churches or villages, the bathroom facilities may not be a Western toilet and the sanitation standards may not be what you are used to. Bring travel toilet paper with you as well as plenty of hand sanitizer.

Your guest house or hotel will have electrical outlets, but you will need an adaptor. Ethiopia uses 220 volt, the US uses 110, so you will need an Africa 2-pin adaptor, and a transformer if your device does not switch from 220 to 110 internally. (If you are unsure or have questions, please ask your team leader.) Electricity in Ethiopia is periodically turned off. This can affect your hotel/guest house or perhaps a restaurant where you are eating. The people in Ethiopia are accustomed to this inconvenience and you, too, must "go with the flow". It is recommended to carry a small flashlight with you.

Most hotels and some guest houses have laundry services that you can personally pay for. The prices are reasonable, and generally speaking your clean clothes will be returned to you the next day. However, itineraries and services sometimes do not coincide, so pack enough essentials for your entire stay in Ethiopia.

Ethiopian food is very tasty, but not everyone will think so! Consider bringing protein or granola-type bars with you. Please be culturally sensitive and keep your opinions to yourself. Western food is served at most hotels and restaurants. The water in Ethiopia is NOT to be consumed unless it is boiled (like for coffee or tea). Drinking water will be purchased daily for your use. There are no fast food restaurants in Ethiopia.

Alcohol consumption is forbidden during your stay in Ethiopia. According to Ethiopian Christian tradition, Christians do not consume alcohol, and we will abide by this cultural tradition. The same applies to tobacco products.

Language may be a barrier to effective communication at times. There will always be someone on the team who is bilingual, and generally language is not a problem. Please be considerate and patient in any setting where there is potential for misunderstanding and go to your team leader with concerns. The people love for you to incorporate Amharic words into your vocabulary and will be delighted to help you learn.

Transportation will be arranged for you. However, we ask that you be patient and relaxed if rides are not prompt or if traffic is heavy. The roads in Ethiopia can be a real challenge! We will rent various sized vehicles depending on the team size. Courtesy to all Ethiopians and fellow team members is an expectation in all situations.

There is no credit in Ethiopia, so do not expect to use credit cards. All shopping is on a cash basis. However, there are usually ATM's available at certain banks and hotels. They are occasionally out of cash or out of service, so it is advised to not depend on them. Bring enough cash with you for personal shopping. The money you bring needs to be crisp, newer bills (not older than 2000). As with many countries, new currency is expected, and bills that are worn, torn, or have markings will not be accepted for exchange. Shopping days are planned into the schedule. Food, lodging, and transportation will be arranged for you and paid for from the trip fee.

In the capital city of Addis Ababa, beggars will be at your window asking for a handout any time the car is stopped. You cannot begin to help them all, so you will have to determine who you want to help and how much you want to spend, although we recommend that you not be overly lavish with your money. Large tips perpetuate the idea that Westerners are extremely rich and easy to get money from. Part of your team fees provide for the resources used in the humanitarian efforts your team will be involved in, so you may, if you choose, ignore their pleadings. Also, it is illegal to give to a beggar approaching a car that is in traffic. Your driver will be ticketed, and we have been asked to please refrain from violating this law.

If there is an interruption to the mission trip due to a natural disaster or political upheaval and the travel insurance does not cover all expenses incurred, Adoption Ministry is not responsible for the payment of these additional costs. Adoption Ministry will work with you to get you home safely, but you will be expected to pay for all extra expenses.

Cancellation Policy

Application deposits of \$100 are non-refundable and non-transferable. If you cancel after airline seats have been *reserved*, there will be a \$300 cancellation fee. Once airline tickets have been *purchased*, those costs cannot be refunded.

In the event that you cancel your trip and other costs have been incurred, you will be responsible for all financial commitments that have been made, including but not limited to: airline tickets, hotel reservations and in-country transportation.
