This year's event will be held at the **Gateway to the Rockies Conference and Event Center in Aurora**. Please see the registration form **on page 9** for details.



From the President's Pen....

In the last few months, you have heard me and John Arnold, President of CMC (Colorado Motorsports Council), saying how money is needed to build a new Front Range racetrack to replace Second Creek Raceway. As of August 12th, money donations are no longer required because a new racetrack is not in the foreseeable future. In the past three months, certain parties have worked against the racetrack development plan that John Arnold has worked on for the last year and a half. Their work has now paid off for themselves.

During those last three months I have attended four meetings that were to finalize plans to build a new racetrack for the Front Range. At each of these meetings very little was discussed about the new racetrack. They were meetings based on power, control, profit, character assassination, and the crucifixion of John Arnold. Those meetings worked for the parties working against a replacement racetrack. John Arnold was on the Board of Directors for Second Creek Raceway and President of CMC. Todd Eyster was the BMW Car Club representative to CMC and on the Second Creek Raceway Board of Directors. Both John Arnold and Todd Eyster now have both resigned their respective positions. In addition, the Treasurer of CMC, and representatives to the Second Creek Board of Directors from Rocky Mountain Vintage Racing, and Porsche Club of America are rumored to either be resigning or replaced in the near future.

CMC and the Second Creek Raceway Board of directors have run Second Creek without question and

lots of improvements in the last eight years. What happened in the last three months to kill the development of a new racetrack?

For some people to fill their needs for money, power and control the majority of car club members in the Front Range, well over 2000, have lost a 2005 replacement racetrack. Greater than the racetrack loss they have also lost people whom, through volunteer efforts, put in not only a lot of their own time and knowledge but, also their hearts. Those people will be very hard to replace.

What does all this mean to ZCCC? First, it appears that after November of 2004 we won't have a local racetrack to drive on. We will have the Colorado State Patrol track but that is not a racetrack. Secondly, results from all of the work that John Arnold has done on acquiring land, money, and county commissioners approval is now gone with the takeover of CMC and Second Creek Raceway. A new Front Range racetrack is not a reality for at least two years from now.


As President of ZCCC I, like most members, feel that the Front Range needs a replacement racetrack. Also, it is my feeling that in the future ZCCC will stand behind efforts to build a track that will be run much like Second Creek Raceway. However, ZCCC does not want for a profit racetrack corporation and ZCCC will not **donate** money to that corporation.





We have arranged a fun filled weekend Sept 3rd thru the 6th 2003. Included in this package is The Renaissance Hotel at a unbelievable \$59.00 a night per couple. DYNO DAY Testing by Dick Spear

Curious about how much horsepower your car is really putting out at the rear wheels? Well, **Saturday September 20, 2003 at 9:00 AM** is when you can find out the real deal. Redline Motorsports, a high end import and domestic performance shop in Fort Collins, has designated the 20th of Sept. as ZCCC's day on the dyno (dynamometer). The dyno shows how much horsepower you are getting at the rear wheels not at the flywheel where the factory rates horsepower.

Now you ask, how much is this going to cost. Well, pricing for three runs on a dyno in the Front Range is anywhere from \$65 to \$100 dollars. Redline has offered ZCCC a great deal. If we have 15 or less vehicles show up you'll be able to get three runs on Redline's dyno for \$45. If we have more than 15 vehicles show up the price drops to \$40 for 3 runs. These vehicles don't have to be Z cars. If you choose to take three runs between each run you can adjust timing, boost, and anything else you think will make you go faster. At the end of each run, you'll get a report graphically showing horsepower, torque and rpm. In addition, if you so choose, Redline will give you a report on the car's fuel/air ratio readings during each run.

Scott and/or Steve from Redline Motorsports will be guest speakers at our General Meeting on Sept. 10th to answer any questions that you may have about running your car on the dyno. In addition, they'll bring some goodies and a few dyno gift certificates that will be given away as door prizes at the meeting.

This is a great opportunity, especially for bragging rights; to find out how much horsepower your car is really putting out. It's also good for setting a baseline before making any performance improvements to your car. See you at the General Meeting on the 10th and at Redline Motorsports, Sept. 20th at 9:00 AM.






If you have two-way radios, please bring them along and set the dial to 5.30. Please see Larry or Patty Troxell at the September and October general meetings for further information.
