1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 The Contractor shall perform painting and related services in accordance with Attachment 1, for real property owned or managed by the U.S. Government located at the following addresses:

- a) CMR - 500 Lisgar Road, Rockcliffe Park, Ottawa, Ontario
- b) DCR - 46 Rockcliffe Road, Rockcliffe Park, Ottawa, Ontario

1.2 The Contractor shall complete all work, including furnishing all labor, materials, tools, transportation, equipment and services, required under this contract for firm-fixed price and within the time specified. The price listed below shall include all labor, materials, overhead (including cost of Workers' Compensation and War-Hazard Insurance, which shall not be a direct reimbursement) and profit.

1.3 All prices are in local currency and the Government will make payment in local currency.

2. PRICING

3. NOTICE TO PROCEED

After contract award and submission of acceptable insurance certificates, the Contracting Officer shall issue a Notice to Proceed. The Notice to Proceed will establish a date (a minimum of ten (10) days from date of contract award unless the Contractor agrees to an earlier date) on which performance shall start.

4. WORKING HOURS

The Contractor shall perform all work during weekdays, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. except for the holidays identified in Section 2, DOSAR 652.237-82, "Observance of Legal Holidays and Administrative Leave. The Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) may approve other hours, if the Contractor gives a request 3 days in advance. Contractor initiated changes in work hours will not be a cause for a price increase.

6. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

6.1 Performance/Payment Protection

The Contractor shall furnish some form of payment protection or security approved by the Government, such as letter of credit/guaranty, in the amount of 50% of the contract price in Canadian dollars.

The Contractor shall provide the information required by the paragraph above within ten (10) calendar days after award. Failure to timely submit the required security may result in rescinding or termination of the contract by the Government. If the contract is terminated, the Contractor will be liable for those costs as described in FAR 52.249-10, Default (Fixed-Price Construction), which is included in this purchase order.

The bonds or alternate performance security shall guarantee the Contractor's execution and completion of the work within the contract time. This security shall also guarantee the correction of any defects after completion, the payment of all wages and other amounts payable by the Contractor under its subcontracts or for labor and materials, and the satisfaction or removal of any liens or encumbrances placed on the work.

The required securities shall remain in effect in the full amount required until final acceptance of the project by the Government. Upon final acceptance, the penal sum of the performance security shall be reduced to 10% of the contract price. The security shall remain in effect for one year after the date of final completion and acceptance, and the Contractor shall pay any premium required for the entire period of coverage.

6.2 Insurance

The Contractor is required by FAR 52.228-5, "Insurance - Work on a Government Installation" to provide whatever insurance is legally necessary. The Contractor shall at its own expense provide and maintain during the entire performance period the following insurance amounts:

General Liability (includes premises/operations, collapse hazard, products, completed operations, contractual, independent contractors, broad form property damage, personal injury)

The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising there from, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", as an additional insured with respect to operations

performed under this contract.

7. CONSTRUCTION PERSONNEL

7.1 The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The Contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing, that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

After receipt of the Notice of Award, the Contractor has ten (10) calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer the following requirements for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks: (1) list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project, and (2) completed Authority for Release Information of each personnel. The Contractor shall use the form provided under Section 1, Attachment 3.

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or re-submittal of the application.

Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This badge may be revoked at any time due to the falsification of data, or misconduct on site.

The Contractor shall provide an English speaking supervisor on site at all times. This position is considered as key personnel under this purchase order.

8. MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

The Contractor shall provide all necessary painting supplies and equipment, including brushes, rollers, buckets, mixers, space heaters, drop cloths, scrapers, sanding gear, electric sprayers, and texture sprayers if necessary to perform the work. No materials will be furnished by the Government.

SCHEDULE OF SUPPLIES/SERVICES, BLOCK 20
DESCRIPTION/SPECIFICATIONS/WORK STATEMENT

1. GERNERAL REQUIREMENTS

This project includes complete preparation, repairs, priming and painting of all painted surfaces mentioned below. All paint shall be Benjamin Moore collection edition. Paint surfaces as directed by the task order. Match paint to similar adjacent materials or surfaces. At a minimum the contractor shall apply one coat of paint. If bleed through is evident after the first coat the contractor shall apply additional coats of paint, primer, etc. as necessary to eliminate bleed through.

Task 1, first floor:

All walls, ceilings and trim work in the: living room, dining room, lobby, sunroom, closets, washrooms, pantry and kitchen area.

Task 2, second floor:

All walls, ceiling and trim work in the lobby, bedrooms, offices, bathrooms, closets, and staircases.

Task 3, third floor:

All walls, ceiling and trim work in the lobby, bedrooms, bathrooms, closets, offices and staircases.

Floor plans with room dimensions for each property shall be provided by the U.S. Government. See Attachment 1.

2. CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY

2.1 The Contractor shall address the impact of the consequent disruption and provide for a continuing level of operation of the building official functions caused by the proposed construction.

2.2 The Contractor shall be required to prepare reports, bill of materials, quality control schedules, and construction costs. These documents shall provide the necessary interfaces, coordination, and communication between the Embassy and the constructor, and special disciplines for the delivery of a completed painting project.

2.3 The Contractor shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, and the coordination of all work and other services furnished under this contract. The Contractor shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its work and other services.

2.4 The Contractor is responsible for safety, and shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs and practices pertaining to labor, safety and similar matters. The Contractor shall promptly report all accidents resulting in lost time, disabling, or fatal injuries to the COR.

2.5 The Contractor shall be, and shall remain, liable to the Embassy in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the residence caused by the Contractor's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this contract. The rights and remedies for the Embassy provided for under this contract are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

2.6 The Contractor shall examine all the documents and visit the construction site in advance of submitting a price quotation, to fully inform themselves of all the conditions and limitations applied to the work, and will then submit a firm fixed price cost proposal for all the work. No subsequent allowance will be made to the Contractor for neglect of the existing conditions.

2.7 The Contractor shall provide a statement that the Contractor's company and its workers assigned to carry out this project are qualified to install manufacturer's materials and are experienced in this type and scope required for the work.

2.8 No construction shall begin until the Warranty and Bill of Materials are accepted and approved by the Contracting Officer.

2.9 The Contractor shall be responsible for all required materials, equipment and personnel to manage, administer, and supervise the interior painting project. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner as determined by the COR.

2.10 All materials and equipment incorporated into the project shall be new. The Contractor shall transport and safeguard all materials and equipment required for construction. The Contractor shall obtain primary products from a single manufacturer, which has successfully produced these materials for at least ten years.

2.11 The Contractor shall have no access to or be admitted into any building on the compound outside the areas designated for the project except with permission by the COR.

2.12 The Contractor will be permitted to use a limited area in the Garage to store construction equipment and materials temporarily. The Contractor is responsible for obtaining any additional off-compound storage areas required.

2.13 The Contractor shall at all times keep the work area free from accumulation of waste materials. Upon completing construction, the Contractor shall remove all temporary facilities and leave the project site in a clean and orderly condition acceptable to the COR.

2.14 The Contractor shall be responsible for connection of temporary utilities to existing utilities, including water, power, and telephone lines. All temporary connections to local water, power, and telephone lines shall be coordinated with the Embassy.

3. DELIVERABLE SCHEDULE

3.1 The Contractor shall complete the entire work no later than 10 work days for each residence. The Contractor shall be required to commence work under this contract on the date stated in the notice to proceed, prosecute the work diligently and achieve final completion and acceptance of this project including final cleanup of the premises within the contract period specified.

3.2 All deliverables shall be in the English language. Any system of dimensions (English or metric) shown in any deliverables shall be consistent with the language used in the contract. No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Contracting Officer (CO) or Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) in approving such deliverables, if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required in the contract.

4. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

- 4.1 The Contractor shall propose and provide detailed specifications of materials and project time schedule.
- 4.2 The Contractor shall provide warranty, in writing, on materials and workmanship, from the date of project completion.
- 4.3 The Contractor shall provide manufacturer's warranty on materials.
- 4.4 All repairs shall be approved, inspected, and brought to total satisfaction to the Contracting Officer and the Contracting Officer's Representative.
- 4.5 Before any work, including painting, shall begin, the Contractor shall protect the furniture, floors, and any parts of the residence that can be damaged due to the work that will be performed in any area. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damage caused by a lack of protection or negligence.
- 4.6 The Contractor shall be responsible to maintain a safe passage, free of any debris or hazardous materials around the work area, for all occupants and visitors to the residence, to prevent any accidents.
- 4.7 The Contractor shall be responsible for the removal and disposal of all debris from the residence. Clean up shall be conducted at the end of each workday and at the completion of the project.
- 4.8 The Contractor shall store any material for the project in an area designated by the COR. The Contractor shall park all vehicles only in areas designated by the occupants or COR.
- 4.9 The Contractor shall schedule all work during the weekdays, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8am and 4pm. The Contractor shall provide the COR a written request three days in advance for an increase in the hours allowed to work, and the COR must approve any changes to the work schedule.
- 4.10 Any changes to this Scope of Work shall have the approval, in writing, from the U.S. Government's Contracting Officer (CO) or the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR).
- 4.11 Advance payment is not authorized under the contract and shall not be granted. However, monthly progress payments shall be permitted subject to the review and approval of the CO and COR.

- 4.12 If the Contractor fails to complete the work within the time specified in the contract, or any extension, the Contractor shall pay liquidated damages to the Government in the amount of one percent (1%) of the total contract amount for each calendar day of delay until the work is completed or accepted.
- 4.13 Onsite work shall be limited to a maximum of 10 work days for each residence. This date shall include repair, installation of new materials and project cleanup.
- 4.14 The Contractor shall provide all necessary supplies and equipment needed to perform the work.

5. OTHER WORK REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 The contractor shall specifically list all equipment, services, and/or materials that the contractor will not provide as a part of this project.
- 5.2 The contractor is responsible for any damage, theft or loss, which occurs as a result of the contractor's actions and/or inaction to prevent such losses.
- 5.3 The contractor shall ensure that the work site is cleaned up every day and free of safety hazards as a result of the contractor's action or inaction.
- 5.4 The contractor shall be responsible for safeguarding all U.S. government property, which he and/or his employees, come into contact with during the work period.
- 5.5 All aspects of this project including required documentation must be completed or submitted as required before final payment will be authorized.
- 5.6 The Contractor shall perform this project in accordance with U.S. and host country codes and standards.

Standard One Year Warranty

Scope of Work/System Description:

Specification Sections Related to Scope of Work/Systems:

_____, Hereinafter referred to as the Contractor, agrees to the following:
(Contractor Company Name)

Hereinafter, The United States Government will be referred to as the Owner.

The Contractor shall be responsible for the proper performance of the Work only to the extent that the design and specifications permit such performance.

Subject to the above, the Contractor agrees to correct promptly at his own expense, defects or deficiencies in the Work which appear prior to and during the period of one (1) year from the date of Substantial Performance of Work, or within such longer period of time as may be specified for certain Products or Work, except that the warranty period for any Work identified by the Owner as not having been substantially completed at the date of Substantial Performance of Work will commence on the date all work is actually completed to acceptance of Owner. In making the repairs or correcting the deficiencies, the contractor shall coordinate such activities as to cause minimum disruption to the activities of the Owner. In addition to the obligation to repair and correct defects and deficiencies as aforesaid, the contractor shall be responsible for all direct costs incurred by the Owner related to or arising from the correction of repair activity undertaken by the Contractor. The provisions of any special warranties set forth in the specifications are in addition to and not in substitution of this warranty. Where manufacturers offer, as a general policy, extended warranties on their Products greater than those called for in the specifications the Contractor shall submit certification of such extensions or benefits before the final claim for payment to the same.

The Contractor agrees to pay for damage resulting from corrections made under the requirements of the clause above.

During the warranty period, the Owner shall promptly give the Contractor written notice of observed defects and deficiencies.

The Contractor shall also enforce the warranty obligations of his subcontractors, manufacturers and suppliers.

The Contractor shall correct at its own expense subsequent defects in the corrected Work appearing within a period of one (1) year from the date of acceptance of the corrected Work by the Owner, or within such longer period as specified for certain Products or Work, and the entire warranty period as aforesaid in respect of such corrected Work shall commence again.

- (5) FSC 9410, Crude Grades of Plant Materials;
- (6) FSC 9430, Miscellaneous Crude Animal Products, Inedible;
- (7) FSC 9440, Miscellaneous Crude Agricultural and Forestry Products;
- (8) FSC 9610, Ores;
- (9) FSC 9620, Minerals, Natural and Synthetic; and
- (10) FSC 9630, Additive Metal Materials.

“Place of manufacture” means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

“Restricted business operations” means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate—

(2) Service-disabled veteran means a veteran, as defined in [38 U.S.C. 101\(2\)](#), with a disability that is service-connected, as defined in [38 U.S.C. 101\(16\)](#).

“Small business concern” means a concern, including its affiliates, that is independently owned and operated, not dominant in the field of operation in which it is bidding on Government contracts, and qualified as a small business under the criteria in 13 CFR Part 121 and size standards in this solicitation.

(ii) The offeror has certified that all the offered products to be supplied are designated country end products.
