Audiology Amplification Update X

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This course is designed as a state of the art update of contemporary audiological practice, including vestibular, tinnitus, cochlear implants, hearing aids, and related auditory rehabilitation topics. Although it is intended as a course for practicing audiologists, professionals engaged in hearing aid dispensing, audiology graduate students, physicians, and others involved in the management of adults and children with hearing disorders will also benefit. The format consists of four primary components: lectures presented by renowned faculty from around the country, moderated question and answer periods at the conclusion of each morning and afternoon session, moderated panel discussions, and updates on new technology presented by manufacturer representatives.

- Recent physiologic findings in the central nervous system of tinnitus patients;
- Understanding of how treatment outcomes can be explained by new tinnitus theories;
- New approaches to hearing preservation for cochlear implant patients;
- Important factors in the medical assessment and management of the adult dizzy patient;
- Relationship between motor milestones and vestibular disturbances in children;
- Vestibular evaluation protocols for neonates, infants and young children;
- Treating adult hearing loss with hearing aids and beyond.
