PEANUT & NUT ALLERGIES

We have students in our school who have a severe allergy to peanuts and nuts. For these children, eating, touching or smelling nuts and products containing peanuts, or peanut oil could trigger an allergic reaction called anaphylaxis. This reaction could be life threatening. For this reason, we ask that you do not send any peanuts, nuts, nut or peanut products, or peanut oil to school.

Many children and adults enjoy eating nuts, peanuts, baking with nuts and peanuts, and peanut butter sandwiches. We are requesting that students and adults do nut bring nuts or peanut containing foods to school for snacks or lunches. This will require reading product labels carefully.

Please help your child to understand the importance of not sharing food, utensils and food containers with other students. Also, please remind your child about the importance of having clean hands. Young children may need lots of reminders and assistance to wash their hands thoroughly before and after they eat.

Kindly remember to send peanut-free and nut-free treats for birthdays and other classroom celebrations!

Thank you very much for your understanding and support in this matter. We look forward to working together with our school community to make RLC a "peanut and nut sensitive" school and a safe environment for ALL of our children. Classes for 2010/2011

As in previous years at RLC, all the students will return to the classroom they had last year on the first and possibly subsequent days. New students will report to the Library. There are many factors considered when making placement decisions which include class size, students' needs in academic/social/emotional/behavioural areas, student leadership, gender ratio, composition regulations and parent input. Under the School Act, it is the school's responsibility to make the placement of the student to a teacher.

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

This program will operate again this year. When your child is absent or delayed in arrival to school, we ask that you phone 250-828-6094 before the school day starts and leave a message. Our Safe Arrival parent volunteers phone a home if a student is absent and no message has been left with us. We need volunteers to help with this program. The job requires only 10 - 40 minutes starting at about 8:45 am in the school office. Call Mrs. Sharpe at the school office if you have questions or you wish to volunteer. Each family should have received a fridge magnet that clearly shows our Safe Arrival phone number. Thank you to our Parent Advisory Council for purchasing this item, and please leave it handy on your fridge. If you require one please call the school.

 - Distance to designated school for that attendance area is more than 4.8km; or Distance to bus route is more than 3.2 km.

LUNCHES

Students who can go home for lunch have the choice of staying at school or going home. If they are going home please provide a note advising the school. For those students who remain at school for the lunch break, lunches are eaten in their own classrooms from 12:35 to the 12:50 bell. Activities from 12:00 to 12:35pm are generally outside, depending on the weather. Both PAC and the staff have indicated a strong desire to begin Reverse Lunch on the first full day of school, September 8th. This will be on a 2 month trial basis. We are committed to give this our best effort and will be requesting parent feedback during the change. Many of our district schools have changed to this format and have basically said that "They would never return to the old way.", "Students are actually eating their lunches that they bring from home.", and numerous other benefits. We are looking forward to *Kids Play and then Eat* being a healthy change for our students.

No Child Without - Medic Alert Program

Our school is involved in the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation's No Child Without program. There is no cost for students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14th birthday to join MedicAlert through this program. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis, then you should consider this program. A child's MedicAlert identification can alert school staff, friends, coaches and others about your child's medical condition should an emergency occur.

If your child is already part of the No Child Without program and there have been changes to their medical condition, medications or emergency contact information, call MedicAlert at 1-800-668-1507 to update your child's file.

School Supplies 2010-2011

School supplies may be purchased at the school. This ensures that the school will supply all pens, paper, etc., for the school year, as the child needs them. We encourage parents to use this system as it is economical and provides consistency of materials throughout the classroom. Primarily Music for Grades K through 3 is a series of 3 concerts performed by the Kamloops Symphony Orchestra (KSO). Young Peoples Concerts (YPC) for Grades 4 through 7 are a series of 4 concerts held at Sagebrush Theatre. The cost of the concerts includes bus transportation which has increased due to fuel costs. This has increased the cost of the KSO concerts since bus transporation is not subsisdized as it is for YPC.


