The Central Valley Flood Management Planning Program is convening various work groups to provide a venue for multiple agencies, interest groups and individuals to be involved in development of the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan (CVFPP), and is inviting and accepting volunteers to participate in these work groups.

The **Climate Change Scope Definition Work Group** will be chartered to develop goals and objectives for incorporating climate change considerations in the 2012 CVFPP and future update. In particular, this work group will provide input on the following questions:

- 1. What are the key aspects of climate change that would affect the integrated flood management and should be covered in the 2012 plan?
- 2. What are the primary categories of existing problems and expected future challenges related to climate change within the study area?
- 3. What are the climate change considerations that should be addressed when working on integrated flood management within the 2012 plan?
- 4. What are the key climate change studies and adaptation planning that the Central Valley Flood Protection Plan should coordinate with?
- 5. What are the uncertainties associated with climate change that may affect the flood management planning and considerations for other resource areas?

This work group will be conducted in coordination with the California Department of Water Resources' (DWR) existing Climate Change Technical Advisory Group established for the California Water Plan Update.

The Climate Change Scope Definition Work Group will be limited to a maximum of 25 people to allow for facilitated dialogue and interaction. DWR seeks group members who will represent a broad range of interests and perspectives. Work group members will be selected by DWR.
