Having now been in the area over an hour the search was abandoned and course set for base. Once again this leg was accomplished by astro, position lines only being obtained at the Salween and Irrawaddy. The coast was reached at a point of Pos. A after 10 hours flight on astro. The weather was clear over Bengal and the trip completed on E.T.A.
