Help Wanted

When I started at Meals on Wheels in 2011, I did a lot of research on the problems facing our older population. I was appalled to find out that 1 in 7 seniors faces the threat of hunger. Just a few weeks ago, new statistics came out and the numbers are even worse. The most recent figures indicate that nearly 1 in 6 seniors faces the threat of hunger. That means 15.2% of seniors, or 8.8 million people, struggle regularly to



put a meal on their table. We know that poor nutrition has a serious physical impact on seniors, in effect it ages them 14 years. So, a 64 year old senior suffering from hunger issues is likely to have the limitations of a 78 year old and the corresponding health issues.

I cannot change the national statistics, but I can have an impact in this community—and so can you! The first thing we need to do is make sure everyone understands what is available. Meals on Wheels provides freshly made meals to people of all ages with a variety of dietary needs. If you know of someone who might need help, either temporarily or for the long term, ask them to give us a call, we do not have waiting lists. If they are too proud to ask for help, let them know that they can pay for their meals—Meals on Wheels serves people of all income levels. One of the most important things we can do to preserve long-term health is make sure everyone has adequate nutrition. I would appreciate your help and advocacy as we work to make a difference in the lives of people right here in our community. Thank you. Jus
