Pomeroy Community Center Seeley Theatre Restoration

The Seeley Theatre restoration continues to proceed and accomplish goals as described in our 2011 grant submission. The project participants for Phase One "Lets Get The Lights On" portion of the Seeley Theatre restoration included the following: Blue Mountain Community Foundation, US Bank, Puget Sound Energy Foundation, Flynn's Electric, Pomeroy Community Center, Pomeroy Chamber of Commerce, and Garfield County residents.

Garfield County is located in the SE corner of Washington State, between Asotin and Columbia counties; this geographically diverse region is bordered on the North by the Snake River and on the South by the Blue Mountains, affording year-round recreation. Community pride and the rural charm of this neighborly community, create a safe and welcoming environment for families and business. Historically, an agricultural region, Garfield County's business economy is based largely in service, retail and small production. Garfield County's rich pioneer history lives on in the local preservation of its historic buildings, houses and family farms. Pomeroy is located along U.S. Highway 12, with connections to major interstates.

Phase I "Let's Get the Lights On" at the Seeley Theatre was completed in November 2011 with the installation of the electrical panels, meter, grounding, and hook-up to the transformer. The proposed timeline for completing this portion of the restoration project was met as planned to install electrical service, and move forward to a fully restored facility as future grants and fundraising is achieved

Immediate scheduled project items include fundraising for additional electrical work to the building, emergency and exit lighting portions of the project, and payoff of the facilities five year mortgage. Other project items will be completed as funding allows. This includes brick pointing, plaster repair, heating and cooling, wood working, seat repair, sidewalk replacement, and installation of the projection and sound systems.

The Pomeroy Community Center continues to collaborate with community organizations, students, citizens, and alumni for fundraising, private foundations and grants will continue to be solicited to successfully reach our goal of a restored and operating Seeley Theatre.

The selected bid for Phase I Let's Get the Lights On was \$7,000. The completion of this portion of the electrical install was a total cost of \$10,127.79. The additional cost was due to moving the external CT Panel on the external East wall. This was necessary for structural reasons. The original estimated project was paid for by the \$2,000 Blue Mountain Community Foundation Grant, \$1,000 US Bank Grant, \$1,500 Grant from the Puget Sound Energy, a work credit donation of \$1,150.93 from Flynns Electric, and fundraising funds by the Pomeroy Community Center. The contractor graciously agreed to carry the remaining balance of \$3,476.86 which is being paid by the Pomeroy Community Center as fundraising projects are completed.

The Blue Mountain Community Foundation is to be commended for the ease of which organizations and individuals can apply for project grant assistance. The organization and personnel are friendly and helpful during the grant application and reporting process. The foundations commitment to "Healthy Communities" is to be much-admired, and we look forward to collaborating with you in the future.
