# **Raikes helps transition**

The Raikes Foundation recently awarded Spokane Public Schools a \$150,000 grant to develop a transition plan for students moving from sixth to seventh grade.

The grant will be used to implement effective transition strategies for Shaw and Garry middle schools' feeder schools – Bemiss, Cooper, Logan, Regal, Stevens, Arlington, Lidgerwood, Linwood, Longfellow, Madison, Whitman and Willard elementaries.

While officials are only in the fact-finding stages, they expect the plan to include such strategies as personalizing the registration process, increasing parent involvement and providing more opportunities for sixth graders to visit middle schools. Social/emotional supports will be a key focus as well, with an aim to help students feel they are part of a school community.

### **SPRINT orientation March 15**

An orientation for parents interested in SPRINT is Tuesday, March 15, at 6 p.m. at Shaw Middle School. SPRINT is a parent participation program for parents of middle-school students in Spokane Public Schools. The seventh and eighth grade students attend classes at Shaw.

The program is based on the assumption that parents have the right to be involved in their children's education, but also the responsibility to provide input for decision making in the program. Teachers, students, and parents work together as a team to help each student achieve his or her potential. Those self-motivated students who are excited by learning through research, observation, and interaction often excel in SPRINT.
