Webcasting STP

The purpose of webcast education is to allow students who find it difficult to participate due to their geographical location to the St. Paul office, to still be involved in the STP classes.

AGC of Minnesota will be offering four STP units in the March-April session via webcast. Webcast training allows a student to dial-in through a computer via the Internet to see and hear the presenter and the presentation (i.e. Power Point). Audio is broadcast via a telephone line.

If you are interested in completing any of the STP units offered via webcast, you will need the following:

- A dedicated learning space free from distractions that allows you to focus on the course uninterrupted. Because you are participating via webcast the instructor will likely be calling on you during class to ensure you are participating.
- A dedicated telephone line to dial in on the 800 number which places you in a conference call. Because you will be dialing in on a conference line you will be heard by the entire class—hence the need for a dedicated relatively quiet learning space.
- A webcast camera is preferred but not required. This allows the instructor to see you.
- A dedicated computer that meets the following requirements:
