Tucson Mountains Meet

Sunday, February 12, 1989

How to get there: Parking is limited at the meet site. Please meet to car pool at the Valley National Bank parking lot at 7175 N. Thornydale. Start times: 9:30 AM to Noon. Course closes at 2PM. Basic, intermediate, and advanced courses can be run as competitive (timed) or recreational. Cost: Individuals (\$4) or teams (\$6). (TOC members \$1 less) Meet director: Ed Rawl

TOC annual memberships dues now run from January to December and are seven dollars for individuals or ten dollars for families (if you only compete as a team with the same people and like to think of yourselves as family, or share a household but not a last name, do it that way.) If your current membership expires sometime in 1989, your next membership will be pro-rated and expire in December of 1989. We're sorry to complicate things in the short run this way, but the future benefits will be worth it. The club has large fees to pay at the beginning of each year and this will enable us to have money in the treasury at the right time. The mailing list can easily be kept up-to-date. You won't have to lie awake at night wondering when to renew your membership. I won't have to wonder if we can keep our bulk mailing privileges. To keep the club viable, we need you to be a dues-paying member. Please join or renew by mail or at the next meet. Thank you.
