Several members of the Yankton Clovers 4-H Club participated in the Spring TSC paper Clover Fundraiser held April 23 thru May 4, 2014. The Spring 2014 Paper Clover Fundraiser which raised \$787,769 to benefit 4-H is the best results ever! 100% of money raised goes to 4-H with 70% of all funds collected supporting local and state 4-H programs. The local club was one of ten selected across the nation in the Paper Clover Sweepstakes. Those who participated were Aaron Friedenbach, David Friedenbach , Laurel Friedenbach, Camille Friedenbach, Tatum Hohenthaner, Leah Waid, and Dakota McCloud. Each member received a t-shirt and a \$15.00 TSC gift card. The club received a \$100.00 TSC gift card and a \$100.00 4-H Mall gift card.



# State 4-H Display Exhibit Plan for 2014

As the new exhibit hall is being built for 4-H on the State Fairgrounds in Huron, there will need to be some temporary adjustments for this year's State Fair 4-H display exhibits. This will be a great opportunity to showcase the educational value of 4-H in your county/unit. There was a great variety of opinions of "what to do" in this transitional year. The State 4-H Event Management Team conducted a Town Hall meeting, sent out a survey, and held a Youth Forum to gather input on how to display exhibits at the State Fair. Input from all three venues was used to form the 2014 plan. What follows is a temporary solution that allows all 4-Hers in South Dakota to continue to experience the State Fair in the best way possible with the least amount of change.

### 2014 Display Exhibit Plan

- Youth may enter 2 display exhibits at the State Fair.
  - o The preferred example would be 1 display exhibit and 1 photography exhibit.
  - Display exhibits will be in the armory (county booths) while photography exhibits will be along the outside walls in Younger and Ag Center (a.k.a. Green Steel North of Livestock Arena)
  - O Photography exhibits will only be the 10" x 14" photo boards. If you want to enter an artistic photo, that would be considered a display exhibit for your county booth.

### What is the rationale?

Last year, just under 3,000 kids brought a display exhibit (including photography) to the State Fair. This resulted in 13,000+ pre-entered displays with just over 10,000 exhibits actually judged. If priority is given to your best two exhibits, around 6,000 exhibits is the maximum potential to be judged in a much smaller area this year.

## Where will everything be housed?

- Counties will be given equal amount of space to display their exhibits in the Armory.
  - A trade show booth (curtains and poles will be set up) approximately 8'x10' in size will be set up for each county including a table and 2 clothing trees
  - A map will be set up to best accommodate county units and counties that travel together.
  - Due to limited space, it is suggested that a mutual agreement between 4-H Youth Program Advisors
    and county 4-H Leaders be in place to deal with situations where there are just too many exhibits for
    the small space. Everything will be judged, but you will only be able to display exhibits within the
    space provided.
- Photography will be displayed on the boards around the perimeters of Younger Hall and Ag Center.
- Booths must be set up for public viewing by 8 am Thursday regardless of judging schedule.

# Additional Adjustments (NEW!)

- County booths will be judged and 2 winners will receive a "Welcome to X County" outdoor metal sign to display at the entrance of the county. Judging criteria for the booths will be:
  - Posters and/or Pictures for County/Unit Youth In Action participants (judging teams, special foods, public presentations, fashion revue) at the State Fair. Many counties do this already. This is a great standard of practice.
  - Promotion of county 4-H program
  - · Utilization of space to display exhibits and quality
  - Educational value of 4-H program in county/unit

## How will the other buildings be utilized?

- Younger--Robotics Challenge all day Saturday and Fashion Revue judging Sunday
- Ag Center (a.k.a. Green Steel North of Livestock Arena)—Horticulture and Sheep Skill-a-thons Friday, Consumer Decision Making Contest and Beef Skill-a-thon Saturday, Dog Skill-a-thon Sunday, Cats on Monday

Don't forget! If you want to participate on the Horticulture or Consumer Decision Making judging teams, you will need to participate in at least 1 judging school. Preference will be given to those that attend 2 or more schools for the state team, and team selection is based on total scores.

# What is Horticulture Judging?

Horticulture judging is being able to select the best produce or flowers in the grocery store. When you're shopping for groceries, you might already be actively judging and selecting produced based on maturity, size, and overall best quality.

# What is Consumer Decision Making?

Consumer Decision Making, or CDM, is being a better consumer! It can range from selecting the proper book bag for school to the right trash bags by utilizing prices, functionality, criteria, and prices. Just like in horticulture, you are already practicing these skills when you are shopping for fashion revue, 4-H projects and every other shopping in between.

# SOUTH DAKOTA ROBOTICS CHALLENGE

Event Overview

The South Dakota 4-H Robotics Challenge is an opportunity for youth who have been learning about robotics to

demonstrate their learning, celebrate their accomplishments, and interact with others who share an interest in

robotics. The most important part of the event is to have fun, so check you worries at the door. The Challenge is

open to the public; spectators, parents, grandparents, friends, class-mates, industry professionals, and educators.

**Event Location** 

The event will be held August 30, 2014 on the South Dakota State Fairgrounds, Huron, SD. The exact location of the event will be released in July with the release of all other 4-H location information. Eligibility

- 1. Team registration is taken on a first-come-first-serve basis through August 15, 2014. This registration deadline will be strictly enforced.
- 2. At least one member of each robotics team must be a 4-H member.
- 3. Teams must have at least three members with a max of 5.
- 4. Novice teams are not required to have any experience with the robotics platforms.
- 5. Advanced and Competitive team members need to be proficient with their chosen platform before the event on August 30th.
- 6. All participants must be at least 8 years old by January 1, 2014, but not have turned 19 years old prior to January 1, 2014.
- 7. There is no age limitations for the Novice or Advanced Divisions. The Competitive Division is divided into two

age groups Beginner/Junior (8-13) and Senior (14-18). The committee reserves the right to divide teams into appropriate groupings during check-in.

\*Number of teams allowed in each division will be announced in July after an official location has been chosen.


