1. 3. Minimum grade point average (4.0 scale) required: **2.0 G.P.A.** Preferred: **2.5 G.P.A.** For specific programs: **N/A**

4. Do you accept GPA as calculated by previous college or do you re-calculate? **As calculated**

5. Maximum number of credits accepted in transfer: **78 college credits**

6. Associate degree required? **No** Preferred? **24 credits but if less we will need the official high school transcripts and SAT or ACT scores.**

7. When does the applicant learn which credits will be accepted in transfer? **Immediately upon acceptance.**

8. Must SAT or ACT scores be submitted by transfer student? **Only if fewer than 24 college credits.**

9. Must high school transcripts or GED be submitted by students with an associate degree? **No**  
Without the degree but with 30 credits or more? **No** With less than 30 credits? **Yes fewer than 24**
