Pet Fosterer Confidentiality Agreement

All Committee Against Domestic Abuse (CADA) Inc. volunteers, interns, staff and contract service providers are expected to hold in strict confidence any and all information concerning CADA clients. Any information about a survivor served by this agency that a contractor, volunteer, intern, or staff member gains from any source is not to be released to anyone other than CADA staff without the direct, informed consent of the survivor/client. This includes, but is not limited to, domestic partners, family members, friends, other agency representatives, etc. as well as family members and/or friends of the survivor/client. Whenever possible, all clients that CADA works with should be informed of CADA's confidentiality policy.

Additionally, for foster parents/families who are working with the CADA Pets volunteer program, the volunteer fosterer must agree to keep confidentiality about any details pertaining to the pet and its family. This includes but is not limited to where the pet is from, the details of the CADA pet program, violence that the pet has endured or witnessed that fosterer knows because it is pertinent to caring for the pet, or the survivor/client's length of stay (including anticipated departure date).

By signing this agreement you acknowledge that you have read and understood CADA's confidentiality policy and commit to this code of ethics regarding confidentiality, in order to serve the best interests of individuals served by this agency.
