Student Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to:

- 1. Perform arithmetic operations on whole numbers, integers, fractions, and decimals.
- 2. Write decimals as percents and vice versa.
- 3. Simplify expressions involving real numbers using the order of operations.
- 4. Simplify algebraic expressions and combine like terms.
- 5. Evaluate algebraic expressions with one variable.
- 6. Apply the appropriate formulas to find the perimeter, area, and volume of geometric figures.
- 7. Identify examples of the Commutative, Associative, and Distributive Laws.
- 8. Solve linear equations in one variable using the addition and multiplication properties of equations.
- 9. Read, interpret, and plot points on a number line and in a plane.
- 10. Write ratios and solve proportions.
- 11. Solve problems using the basic percent equation.
- 12. Identify terms used in the course.
- 13. Apply the concepts learned in the course to solve application problems.
