DECLARATION

(Please read page thoroughly and sign below)

In submitting this application for AACI, P.App or CRA candidacy, and membership in the Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) AND the British Columbia Association of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (BCAAIC), I understand, agree, and pledge the following:

- A. If admitted to candidacy, and thereafter if admitted as a designated member, I pledge to uphold and conform to the Bylaws, Regulations, Code of Professional Ethics, and the Canadian Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC), and the British Columbia Association of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (BCAAIC) and as they may be amended from time-to-time.
- B. I hereby irrevocably waive any claims or causes of action that I may have at any time against AIC, the members of the Board of Directors, the officers and committees of AIC, BCAAIC, the local Chapters and their officers and committees, all officials and employees of AIC, BCAAIC or any local Chapter, and all Members, Candidates or other persons co-operating with AIC, arising out of, or in connection with, any act or failure to act by any or all of the aforementioned in connection with the official activities of AIC. Such acts or failures to act shall include, but shall not be limited to, acts or failures to act in connection with:
 - (1) admitting me to candidacy; and
 - (2) advancing me as a Candidate; and
 - (3) terminating my candidacy; and
 - (4) taking disciplinary action against me as a Candidate or as a designated member.
- C. I understand that as a Candidate, I am not a voting member of AIC or BCAAIC, except as specifically stated in the Regulations or Provincial Bylaws. I further understand that I may identify myself as a Candidate only in strict accordance with AIC policies, and that I must refrain from using initials that might be interpreted as relating to a designated status. I further understand that any misuse of my Candidate status may subject me to disciplinary proceedings conducted pursuant to AIC's Bylaws & Regulations. I further understand that as an applicant for candidacy and as a Candidate I may be required, under appropriate circumstances, to allow members of the Committee of Examiners to consult with people familiar with my work and to examine my files unless prohibited by my employer, in which event I agree to submit sufficient samples of my work-product to allow proper evaluation thereof.
- D. I understand that any certificate, emblem, or other evidence of membership in AIC which may be issued to me, shall at all times remain the property of AIC and shall be held by me in trust. I further agree that if and when my membership in AIC is terminated or suspended, I will immediately return to the Appraisal Institute, upon demand, any such certificate, emblem or other evidence of membership.
- E. I understand that I must complete the general and technical requirements for membership set forth in the AIC regulations for the AACI, P.App and CRA designations, which include, but are not limited to, the successful completion of all education and curriculum requirements, the Applied Experience Program and the successful completion of guided case studies, and any other requirements as set out by the Institute.
- F. I understand that if I am admitted to candidacy I must complete the requirements within the time specified by the Regulations of AIC.
- G. In submitting the application, I represent to AIC that:
 - (1) I have not been convicted of a crime involving fraud, dishonesty, false statements or moral turpitude and I have not committed any act or acts which could lead to my subsequent conviction of any such crime; and
 - (2) There are not now pending against me any criminal indictments or civil actions challenging my good moral character or integrity; and
 - (3) There has not been any other material to challenge my good moral character or integrity.

Applicants for Candidate membership must either:

- a) Hold a university degree at the undergraduate level or higher; OR
- b) Have completed all curriculum requirements for the AACI, P.App designation, less 10 courses

In addition to the above noted requirements, an applicant **must** have successfully completed the minimum introductory education requirements, including the *We Value Canada Workshop* **and** *Foundations in Real Estate Appraisal* (BUSI 330 or approved equivalent), in order to be admitted to Candidate membership. Upon admission to AIC, the Candidate **must** complete the mandatory *Standards Seminar* within 24 months of the date of admission.

WHAT IS A CANDIDATE MEMBER?

Candidate members of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) represent the future of the appraisal profession, individuals who are pursuing the rigorous AIC Program of Professional Studies and preparing to complete the final requirements for one of the Appraisal Institute of Canada's prestigious professional designations.

Admission to candidacy is open only to those who either hold a degree, or who have 10 or fewer remaining requirements for the AACI, P. App designation. To qualify for Candidate membership, you must be of legal age, and have successfully completed the BUSI 330 ~ Foundations of Real Estate Appraisal course (offered through distance education by UBC and other education partners), as well as the AIC We Value Canada workshop (online or classroom version).

Joining as a Candidate entitles you to membership in the Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) and the British Columbia Association of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (BCAAIC) and local chapter.

FAST TRACK TO DESIGNATION

Candidates holding a business or commerce degree from a recognized Canadian university are eligible for admission to the AIC/UBC Post-Graduate Certificate in Real Property Valuation (PGCV). This program leads to AACI, P.App designation upon completion of six courses, the Guided Case Study (BUSI 499) and the experience and examination requirements of the Institute. Individuals who do not meet the Candidate admission criteria outlined above are encouraged to join AIC in the student member category, as they work toward meeting the Candidate member admission requirements. Individuals in the student category can complete one of several distance degree programs in which AIC course credits may be applied toward the requirements of a business degree. Candidate members typically work actively in the profession as appraisers-in-training, within the limits defined by AIC's Standards, policies and regulations. Candidates participate in AIC's Professional Liability Insurance program and can take on increasingly complex assignments as they gain expertise and knowledge, under the direction and mentorship of designated members.

THE BENEFITS OF CANDIDATE MEMBERSHIP

AIC membership entitles you to a wide range of services and benefit programs that respond to the diverse needs of the contemporary appraisal professional (for more information, please visit www.aicanada.ca/e/aboutaic candidate.cfm).

OBLIGATIONS OF CANDIDATE MEMBERS

- 1. Candidates are advanced students of the AIC program who are actively pursuing one of the AIC's professional designations.
- As full members of AIC, Candidates are accorded certain privileges including the right to prepare and take limited responsibility for appraisal reports under the supervision of a designated member.
- Candidates are non-designated members and should not hold themselves out as appraisers or do anything that conveys the notion that they are qualified to render services covered under the Appraisal Institute of Canada's standards of professional appraisal practice on their own.
- 4. Candidates must be insured for errors and omissions in accordance with AIC's bylaws, and if they are signing appraisal reports or similar documents they must be registered with a designated member in good standing of AIC who acts as co-signer for said reports. Failure to do so is a breach of the standards of professional practice and invalidates the insurance coverage on the reports.
- 5. Candidates must be mentored either by the co-signer or another designated member in accordance with AIC's mentoring policies.
- 6. Candidates must participate in the Applied Experience Program, successfully complete a minimum of one university credit course per year, and complete all the requirements for designation with AIC within a ten-year period from date of becoming a Candidate member, failing which they will forfeit their Candidate status.

HOW TO JOIN

Once you have completed all admission requirements outlined above, forward your application for Candidate membership with all supporting documentation and dues to the Provincial Association or Affiliated Provincial Organization in the province in which you reside.
