Preparing for examinations	To prepare for the examination, it is suggested that you read the appropriate study materials listed on the Suggested Study Material Source List included in this packet. Many of the study materials have practice test questions at the end of each chapter that can help you evaluate whether you know the material well enough to pass the exam. For some categories, DPR has posted Knowledge Expectations on their website that outline the type of information you will be expected to know when you take the examination.		
Application fee	The application fee is \$40 for this certificate (3 CCR section 6502). This fee is only required once, provided you become certified within one year.		
Examination fees	The examination fee is \$50 (3 CCR section 6505) for each examination taken (including reexaminations due to rescheduling or failure to pass). However, if you do not show for your examination(s) and do not reschedule you must again submit the exam fees.		
Second-year fee notice	If you pass the required examinations, you may receive a Second-year Fee Notice. This notice will inform you that you have paid for the first year of a 2-year cycle, and that in order to issue your certificate an additional \$30 is required for the second-year fee. The 2-year cycles are illustrated in the table below.

DPR will inform you of the number of approved CE hours you are required to complete. After your first renewal, you are required to accumulate at least 20 hours of approved continuing education (CE) every two years before certificate renewal. Four of the 20 hours must cover the topic of pesticide laws and regulations (3 CCR sections 6511).		
	QAC holders who have only the Maintenance Gardener Pest Control Category (Category Q) are required to complete eight hours of approved CE after their first renewal. Two of the eight hours must cover the topic of pesticides and pest control laws and regulations (3 CCR section 6511). It is your obligation to ensure that you take the required number and topic areas of CE hours prior to renewal of your QAC.

- B. **Applicant Information**: Enter your name, Qualified Applicator Certificate or Exam Identification Number if applicable, address, email address, home, work, and cell telephone numbers, employment type, and current employer (if applicable).
- C. Laws, Regulations and Basic Principles Examination. Exemption. If you have passed the Laws, Regulations and Basic Principles exam within one (1) year or have a current Pest Control Adviser License, Qualified Applicator License, Journeyman Pilot Certificate or Apprentice Pilot Certificate, check the "Exempt" box. To qualify for this exemption, you must enter the number from your current license or certificate.
- D. Examinations. Indicate the examinations you want to take by checking the appropriate boxes. In addition to the Laws, Regulations and Basic Principles examination, each new applicant must successfully pass at least one of the pest control categories (A-P) before a Qualified Applicator Certificate is issued. Applicants seeking certification only in subcategory Q do not need to take the Laws, Regulations and Basic Principles examination. A maximum of four (4) examinations may be scheduled per location (testing may occur at only one location per month). - E. **Examination Schedule**. Indicate the exam month and location in the appropriate boxes. Antifouling Paints or Coatings Containing Tributyltin (Subcategory M)

Parks, golf courses, cemeteries, but only on ornamental or turf plantings near buildings (clubhouses, pro shops, restrooms) that are distinct and separate from the plantings that constitute open space landscaping in a park, golf course or cemetery itself.

*General Use versus Restricted Use Pesticides:

Pesticides are classified into two groups, general use and restricted use. General use pesticides are available for purchase by anyone, provided they are applied according to label instructions on the individual's own property or with permission of the property owner. Restricted use pesticides are available only to certified applicators. Restricted use includes any materials that are hazardous to public health, farm workers, domestic animals, the environment, wildlife, or crops other than those being treated (CFR Title 40, Part 152.160-175).

Maintenance Gardeners who engage in pest control for hire, incidental to their gardening business, must obtain a Maintenance Gardener Pest Control Business License. See the Maintenance Gardener Pest Control Business License Packet for more information at <u>http://www.cdpr.ca.gov/docs/license/app_packets/mgardener.pdf</u>. This category does not include direct application to running or standing water.
