#### National Presenters . . .

#### Claire Harwell, J.D.

Ms. Harwell is a national trainer for police, prosecutors, medical providers, civil attorneys, and counselors. Her clients have included the U.S. Coast Guard, the Massachusetts National Guard, the National Judicial Education Program, the U.S. Air Force, and major universities across the country. Her expertise in sexual assault includes criminal prosecution, civil law, and the neurobiology of trauma. She received her J.D. from the University of New Mexico and prosecuted several high profile violent offenses in New Mexico. Ms. Harwell has been featured on television and international news media.

#### David Lisak, Ph.D.

Dr. David Lisak is an associate professor of psychology at the University of Massachusetts Boston where he conducts research on the causes/consequences of interpersonal violence, with particular focus on the motives and characteristics of "undetected" rapists – men who rape but who are never prosecuted. He studies the long term effects of childhood abuse in adult men, the relationship between early abuse and later perpetration, and his research has been published in leading journals in psychology, trauma and violence. Dr. Lisak has served as faculty for the National Judicial Education Program and the American Prosecutors Research Institute.

#### Anne Munch, J.D.

Ms. Munch has spent most of her 22-year legal career as a prosecutor in Denver, Telluride, and Golden, Colorado where she specialized in crimes of sexual assault and domestic violence. Ms. Munch directed the San Miguel Resource Center, a domestic violence and sexual assault program, and the Ending Violence Against Women Project, a statewide multidisciplinary training and technical assistance project. Ms. Munch works with all branches of the US Military and is on the teaching faculty for the American Prosecutors Research Institute, the National Judicial Education Program, and the International Association of Chiefs of Police.
