## CMA Perspective Installment 24



So, you hold a CPA and you're asking "Why would I want to go to the trouble of getting another certification like the CMA?" The short answer is that the Certified Public Accountant and Certified Management Accountant are very different, and each is suited to a different area of accounting. If you work in a field that is primarily concerned with cost accounting or other type of management accounting the CMA is a more applicable certification for your career.

This in no way reduces the value of a CPA. It is certainly the most widely recognized accounting certification and has a well-deserved reputation for knowledge, competence and professionalism. In the fields of auditing, public accounting and tax practice it is certainly a pre-requisite for success.

For a management accounting professional the CPA is still good, but is not the best measure of the skills and knowledge required for management accounting. The CMA covers a broader and more integrative suite of knowledge that is a better indicator of the expertise required by management accountants. It also demonstrates a commitment to a very high ethical standard.

You owe it to yourself and your career to enhance your value as much as possible. The CMA certification is a great way to show your skills and professional dedication. This is true even if you are already a CPA.





One of the goals that the board set this year was to increase our presence in the local college community. November's technical meeting is designated as "College Night". We have invited students and professors from the local colleges to learn about IMA and also about the advantages of becoming a CMA. ## **New 2-Hour Ethics CPE Requirement**

All CMAs and CFMs are required to complete a minimum of two hours of continuing education on the subject of ethics as part of their 30-hour annual CPE requirement.

IMA's Statement of Ethical Professional Practice is an excellent framework for determining the types of ethics topics that are acceptable. The focus of the ethics education should be principally in the area of management accounting and financial management. Topics should include ethical considerations in the area of decision support, planning, and control for accounting and finance professionals working inside organizations. ICMA encourages members to use education sources that address specific scenarios such as fraud in financial reporting, manipulation of budgets for personal gain, and disclosure of confidential financial information. Also acceptable is coverage of ethics within the general business environment. ima@imanet.org

## **Encourage Teamwork through Brainstorming Sessions**

One of the best ways to build teamwork in the workplace is to conduct brainstorming sessions that allow team members at all levels to participate in open discussions about business challenges and potential solutions. With the accounting landscape continuing to change, group efforts at coming up with creative solutions are an effective way to maintain strong productivity levels. As a manager, these activities can help you identify some of your firm's most innovative thinkers and allow you to maintain a competitive edge by generating fresh ideas.

- Collect ideas in advance. To get staff members thinking creatively, ask each of them to submit a well-thought-out suggestion before the meeting. Remind them there is no such thing as a bad idea, and every approach will be fairly considered. Meet in a comfortable setting with few distractions. Invite free expression by assuring employees their ideas will not be criticized. Having a bank of proposals to draw on can get the discussion off to a quick start and help ensure a productive and efficient session.
- ldentify the most productive time. For most people, morning hours are the most conducive to creative thought. Often, people feel refreshed and relatively free of distractions early in the day, making it ideal for brainstorming sessions.
- Encourage teamwork. Ask participants to build on each other's thoughts. One member's creativity will stimulate an idea from someone else. Brainstorming is a group process and won't be effective if people fail to share their ideas or listen to suggestions from others.
- > Provide food for thought. Without letting food become the focus, light snacks and beverages can be the key ingredient in offering an energy boost to brainstorming meetings.
