


I'm Christine Roob. I work for the State of North Dakota's Department of Health, Division of Waste Management. I joined the Dept in 1988 and have worked with the various database systems through the years. Not only am I the database administrator but I also am involved in permitting, inspections, compliance assistance and corrective action. So in doing my various duties I end up running lots of reports.

This presentation outlines various ways to search the data in RCRAInfo and run reports. The presentation is broken down into three systems, RCRAInfo which I will present, RCRArep which Lynn Metcalf, VT will present and ECHO which Doug Nevel, NY will present, you can use to conduct data searches and run reports.

Data regarding the generators of hazardous waste can assist your program with strategic planning and goals for the agency.

The data can also direct the agency annual planning and budgeting to meet those plans and goals.

Enforcement and compliance assurance programs are focused on producing measurable results (i.e. outputs) to support each Agency's mission of protecting human health and the environment. Program managers use these output measures as short-term indicators of program performance and in longer term trend analyses. The RCRA program continues to expand its use of outcome measures, such as pounds of pollution reduced and behavior change (e.g., improvements to environmental management practices) that result from compliance assurance activities.

RCRAInfo data is used to track/document a State's progress and performance in achieving GPRA Goals, EPA Grant performance measures, and this information is used by EPA to enable reporting such information to Congress.

Which in the long run, protects human health and the environment.



DATA and EPA

- OECA (Office of Enforcement Compliance Assurance) uses RCRAInfo data to establish data metrics for analysis that Regions perform on state programs.
- The accomplishments of enforcement and compliance assurance programs are reported in a variety of documents. EPA integrates these accomplishments into their strategic plan and the program's Government Performance Results Act (GPRA) measures.

A few comments on data in RCRAInfo:

RCRAInfo is THE national repository for program implementation information for the RCRA program, and is the central system which feeds RCRA data to other EPA data systems such as Envirofacts, ECHO, SRF, etc. State implementers have multiple options for feeding the national database: direct web-based data entry, periodic batch translation of data from a state data system, or automated electronic flowing of data from a state data system through the Exchange Network.

If you are new to RCRAInfo our last webinar RCRAInfo 101 is available to give you an overview of the system and is found on ASTSWMO's web site.

As I state before the data in RCRAInfo is used by EPA to report to Congress and released to the public. Therefore it is extremely important that the data entered into RCRAInfo is correct and accurate.

National and Implementer Reports are grouped by module:

Over 229 reports available covering all the data

Many of the modules (for example the handler module) will run reports, but will use default settings. To change the selection criteria you must use the national and implementer reports menu. Each report contains selection criteria so the user can tailor the report for their needs. If it is a field that you enter data in, you can normally find it as selection criteria. However the selection criteria are rather limited.

These reports are used to fulfill FOIA requests, report milestones to Congress and management, ensure data quality and manage program requirements.

Within RCRAInfo, there are links to reports in Region 1's RCRArep, Region 6's RCRAInfo reports and Region 3's Mid-Atlantic Region - Shared Reports.

Region 3 has some additional reports that are not in RCRAInfo and they can be found at USEPA Region 3 RCRAInfo Data Tools webpage:

The top drop down box allows you to options to sort the list of reports.

After you have selected what sort order you want, select the refresh list and a new list of reports with you sort option comes up.

Each report has a "Show Description" button gives a short description of the report that can be run.

Each Report also has a "View Help" button which will take you to RCRAInfo Help which will give detailed information for the report such as a description of the report, sort order and sort options available, sample report output, select logic, selection criteria available and report headings.

Report output: all of the reports are PDFs, however, some reports have the option of output as a delimited text file which you can then put into an Excel spreadsheet.

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Here is a list of some reports I routinely use. I will quickly go over each of these.



This report includes:

basic handler module information;

information about each source record received for the facility,

location and mailing address,

source record and permit contact person (including historical records),

list of NAICS codes,

complete list of regulated waste activities;

and summarized National Biennial RCRA Hazardous Waste Report information by reporting cycle year, including quantity totals (generated, managed, shipped, received), and top ten GM forms by quantity generated.

It can be used to check the site information previously provided against a subsequent notification form. It can also be used for FOIA Report where enforcement data is not requested.

In the lower right corner is an example of the report.



This single line report lists location as well as TSD, Generator, and Transporter status for facilities that meet the user selection criteria.

There are lots of sort options for the report:





<u>FOIA Report of Non-Sensitive Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement Data Report</u>: This report presents available information from the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act Information System (RCRAInfo) about compliance evaluations, violations, and enforcement actions. In order to avoid releasing enforcement sensitive information to the public the following information is not shown on the report: pending civil / judicial referrals, criminal actions and referrals, and State to EPA referrals; all other enforcement actions are released.



This is an example of a FOIA Report of Non-Sensitive Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement Data Report.




CM&E Comprehensive Report – This report provides a complete listing of evaluation, violation, and enforcement activities for each Handler.

Below the Handler ID information, the data is presented in three sections; evaluations, violations, and enforcements.


Comments, referred to as Notes, are provided in the respective sections for evaluations and violations.

You can select date ranges, evaluation types, universes.

I use this report for my SRF Data Validation and completing the midyear and end-of-year reports.



This is an example of a CM&E Comprehensive Report.



BR Data Quality Reports - once you upload your BR data in RCRAInfo, you can start using the reports to check your BR data quality and cross check RCRA hazardous waste receipts and shipments.

After loading your data, you should go to the National Reports Menu and run all the <u>BR Data Quality Reports</u> and compare your 2013 submission to your 2011 submission and vice versa. At the very least you should run the following reports:

Basic RCRAInfo Reporting Tool (BARRT)

- BARRT is an exclusive Build-A-Query interface providing users the capability to create and save their own queries to pull data from RCRAInfo.
- You can also used pre-built queries that other users have created and shared.
- Queries are in Oracle SQL (Structured Query Language).
- Queries returning 5,000 or more records require a conscious decision to execute. Less than 5,000 records will be executed without stopping.
- Be sure that you are familiar with rules governing the release and use of RCRAInfo data for internal data requests for your agency, as well as for responses to Freedom of Information Act requests.
- You can contact a National System Administrator, Idali Gotay (gotay.idali@epa.gov), at HQ to have your query checked for viability and minimize overload to RCRAInfo as a whole.

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Build – a - guery interface so you really don't need to know SQL.

You can save you query so that it can be used over and over again and You can make your query available to everyone in RCRAInfo.

There are pre-build queries in BARTT from others but the descriptions are very short so it make take a while to find one you want. Having said that, there are some very useful reports in there. Take some time and look through them.


You can also import existing SQL queries into BARTT, however you should check with Idali to make sure the query won't cause issues with RCRAInfo.

Output to text file or copy and paste to Excel



There are nine RCRAInfo views you can select from. Once you select a view, click the "Continue using the Build-A-Query Engine" button. This will take you to screens where you can specify fields, provide selection criteria and specify sort order.

The "My Queries" option will take you to a screen where you can access shared queries that are owned by you or others.



Select columns to use on your custom query. The number next to the column specifies the order in which your data will be displayed. When you select the "Continue" button it takes you to other screens where you can further customize your selections, unfortunately we don't have enough time to go through a complete query.

However, EPA has two presentations on the use of BARRT from the RCRAInfo 2008 and 2010 National Users Conferences which can be found in the System Documentation portion of RCRAInfo. "RCRAInfo- News Alerts and General Information- 6. System Documentation-Trainings, Conferences and Webinars column"


RCRARep

- Use your RCRAInfo ID and password to log in.
- RCRARep is a USEPA website developed by EPA Region 1 to access the national RCRA database (RCRAInfo).
- RCRARep is exclusively for the use of EPA and state/local/tribal environmental agencies working in their official capacities.

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RCRARep is an Oracle/Web software reporting tool developed by EPA Region 1 to:

- select RCRA Handlers based on data in any or all RCRAInfo modules or on certain data management criteria (source, receipt/entry date, person who originated or who keyed information)
- 2. Can customize queries easily.
- 3. view or print sensitive nationwide data from RCRAInfo database
- 4. count or view selected Handlers or selected detail
- 5. view GPRA summaries
- 6. view error reports
- 7. get context-sensitive Help
- 8. print reports or download data in Excel spreadsheets



Main Menu:


Main Menu is also where you can change the default state or region to search – It defaults to your state, but if you wanted to see the whole region or another state, this is where you would set it.

GO button - always on lower right hand corner

For help – go to swoosh for context sensitive help or Help menu on Main Menu User Guide – written by Region 1 folks who developed and maintain RCRARep

These options are different ways of querying your RCRAInfo Data and I'll show examples of them.

First, though, I'll show a basic query for one handler




Example of Handler Search from Main Menu:

Can fill in one or more of the boxes, note check other (for Handler ID) and Check Previous (for other criteria)

Using General Electric, click GO

Next Screen is Drill-Down Handler Selection – Can select one handler to drill down into their info OR select Report Options if you want to make a report using all 4 of these facilities (for example, if I wanted to look at the inspection history for all of them together) There is usually enough info on this page to figure out which to select- ID, address, Regulated Activity

I am going to select Plant 2 by clicking on the EPA ID which appears as a link.



The next screen shows the types of detail reports or information you can view for this handler:

Most open a new window so you can view the info then close that window and go back to this screen.


The Map Feature is really slick, it takes the address and plugs it into Google Maps for you; GIS Bing does the same thing in Bing Maps

You can also go back to the Handler List from the previous screen

This facility is subject to Corrective Action so if I choose that, I get a report that includes Handler info and Corrective Action authorities and events

We use this report to send (usually as a pdf by email) to the generator as verification that we issued their number or made changes from a subsequent notification



Going back to Main Menu:

One of the great features of RCRARep is that it has a lot of queries already set up for you.

Left hand side has drop down boxes to select specific options for your query or report. These options are different ways of querying your RCRAInfo Data and I'll show examples of them.

Left hand side has drop down boxes to select specific options for your query or report.

- Counts Menu easy way to look at numbers of handlers in your universe, or numbers of
 evaluations or corrective action events in a date range, there are many options and then
 in addition to the number, you can drill down and look at those handlers (I will show an
 example)
- Select Detail allows the user to select specific detailed reports from categories such as SNY reports, violations, penalties, etc...
- BR Summary shows biennial report info from one handler
- PMT/CA baseline –
- Q/C allows user to select error reports for checking data, such as Enforcement Fails to Address Violations
- Utilities change password





This page allows you to choose the type of report you can save.

Most reports can be saved as a pdf or as a text file. There are also extracts that can be exported as comma delimited text files or as excel spreadsheets for further analysis

The print labels option is great for mass mailings. The (Excel) option in the [EXTRACT] section of the report list allows you to sort and search selected data in a spreadsheet format.





New ECHO public web site

- There is a new ECHO web site http://echo.epa.gov/
- Enforcement and Compliance History Online (ECHO)
- OTIS is retired. ECHO Gov replaces it.
- Useful for inspection targeting (currently has false negatives, i.e. missing sites)
- Updated from RCRAInfo once a week
- Combines air, water and RCRA compliance info
- Includes 5 years of inspection and enforcement info, but only 3 years of compliance/violation status.
- Maps sites, listing compliance status and number of years since last inspection

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OECA created ECHO.

Previously useful for targeting, but I don't currently recommend it.

You can't search for sites not inspected in > 5 years, nor ones never inspected.

Start by clicking the "Learn more about ECHO" link, then "Become an ECHO Pro".

Details about ECHO Modernization are posted at http://echo.epa.gov/echo_modernization New ECHO:

Under Explore Facilities, there are 3 searches: All Data, Advanced Facility Search, and Criminal Case.

Government-only features from OTIS will be provided via password at ECHO Gov. ECHO Gov password:

EPA users can log in with their EPA LAN ID and password, and state users can register for an EPA Portal ID via ECHO.

(With an ID, click Log In at ECHO. After login, you see a Welcome [your user ID] and MyECHO at top right.)

Refresh weekly:

After data are pulled out of the source data system, the ECHO Data Mart shows that data in 2-3 days.


Typically, EPA schedules the data pulls on a Friday, so that data are available on Monday. Duplicate IDs:

ECHO's Detailed Facility Report identifies additional RCRA EPA ID numbers that may exist for a site.

SNCs: In the 'Search Criteria Selected' pane on the right, click X next to 'Active/Operating Yes'.

Select your state.

Expand the 'Enforcement and Compliance' section, and to the right of 'Current Compliance Status', drag the slider to the right until 'Significant Violation/Violator' is selected. Click Search.

On the Search Results screen, click 'Customize Columns', click 'RCRA Current Compliance Status', click 'Add Columns'.

Click header cell for 'RCRA Current Compliance Status' column to sort this column and scroll through list to find group of 'Significant Violation' sites.

Includes any out of state SNCs (activity location).

Notes

- Currently only has a multimedia search, so no searching for only RCRA HW sites, until August 2014
- When searching by whether a site was inspected or not, ECHO counts Financial Record Review (FRR) and Nonfinancial Record Review (NRR) evaluation types, which are not <u>on-site</u> inspections.
- In the Detailed Facility Report, under Enforcement and Compliance, the state that inspected the site, the Activity Location state, is missing. This is because out of state inspections are common for transporters that operate in multiple states (and for manifest violations).

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Last bullet: previous version of ECHO did use the Activity Location state.

Rebecca said it's only searching the Facility Registry System address.

When I tried to search for only RCRA Significant Non-Compliance (SNC) sites in NY, I also got sites that are only SNCs in the Air or Water program.


More Notes

- On the new ECHO Search page, it lists "Active/Operating" under Facility Characteristics. Active is for RCRA sites.
 Operating is for air, not RCRA TSD, sites.
- A longer history is needed to reduce FOIA requests, i.e. > 3 years.
- CERCLA EPA ID numbers should be added to ECHO, since they look just like RCRA EPA ID numbers¹

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¹ CERCLA and Brownfield sites from the EPA CERCLIS and Brownfield dbs should be added and available using ECHO searches. CERCLA ID #s are already in the FRS db.

The reason is that the public and some government staff do not understand the difference between RCRA, CERCLA and Brownfield hazardous waste sites, and that CERCLA and Brownfield sites are <u>not</u> in ECHO. False negative searches from ECHO can lead to misunderstandings.



Issue:

On the Hazardous Waste, Performance Dashboard, in the Inspections pane, the "1 year inspection coverage for TSDFs", and "1 year inspection coverage for SQGs" charts are missing the purple combined bar, and the goal/average line.

State Review Framework (at ECHO GOV)

- Under Oversight
- RCRA SRF metric 8a, SNC id rate, is miscalculated
- Other <u>file</u> metrics aren't in web site searches, e.g. 12b
 Penalty Collection is file based, not data in RCRAInfo
- Metrics query search
- Data Verification search
- Use <u>now</u> requires a password (State users can use any EPA Portal ID they already have, or register for a new one at ECHO.)
- ECHO Gov/Portal ID passwords expire every 90 days.

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EPA uses this to review a state's compliance program performance. SRF includes both data metrics and file metrics. Data metrics use RCRAInfo data, file metrics do not.

The DV and metrics search result pages do not print properly. You can click download button, then print.

Find relevant guidance in ECHO Gov by clicking 'ECHOGov News' tab, then 'Quick Links', then 'Guidance, Policy, and Minimum Data Requirements Information'.


You may already have an ID and password.

The EPA portal is a single gateway to many EPA applications. It allows users to use one ID/pw that can be used in multiple places. The EPA standard page is publicly accessible - https://ssoprod.epa.gov/sso/jsp/oblogin.jsp - you can see if it looks familiar. If not, please just register via the ECHO page and you'll have a portal ID.



To register for a new ID

If you don't already have an ID and password: At ECHO, click 'Log In', then 'Register' buttons.



ECHO Gov/Portal ID passwords expire every 90 days, but ECHO's error message doesn't indicate it expired (when it has).

To change your ECHO Gov password:

States: Go to the EPA Portal https://waa.epa.gov, and log in with your ECHO username and password. If you're not able to login there, follow the link to "Forgot your username or password" on the portal home page to recover your username or reset your password. Once you have logged into the EPA Portal, click the menu link for "User Profile". At the bottom of User Profile page is the change password option.

Impact of Public Access

- In the RCRA program, waste handlers, particularly TSDs are very attuned to what ECHO says about their facilities.
 - Some handlers won't ship waste to TSDs that are having compliance problems.
 - Insurance companies use ECHO to determine risks.
 - Investors examine ECHO to perform "social screenings"
 - Potential land purchasers use RCRAInfo data to perform "due diligence"
 - Facilities with compliance problems have come forward to settle enforcement actions more quickly to "clear up" their ECHO record. They ask "How can I get my facility out of SNC?"
- EPA believes that ECHO is having a positive impact on overall compliance with RCRA.
- FOIA requests significantly drop because ECHO answers key questions.

Watch List update

- The Watch List is a tracking mechanism EPA uses to monitor states timely enforcement of SNCs.
- It is currently unavailable in ECHO Gov and it is temporarily suspended. Per the recent EPA Inspector General report, "EPA Should Assess the Utility of the Watch List as a Management Tool"

(http://www.epa.gov/oig/reports/2013/20130930-13-P-0435.pdf), EPA is reviewing the utility of the Watch List before modernizing or rebuilding it.

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Watch List notes

- The public Watch List at old ECHO did not display responsible agency, which is needed to refer inquiries to the correct agency, EPA or state.
- The old OTIS WL used location state, but should use activity location state for this list to be used by states. That way the agency entering/responsible for out-of-state data will be held accountable.

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There are two versions of WL, one for public (see 1st bullet), and one for agency (see 2nd bullet).

The new agency WL will be under Oversight at ECHO Gov. By Doug Nevel

Tracking Work Plan Commitments

- Three new HQ-owned Commitment Types have been added to RCRAInfo:
 - Alternative Universe for LQG Inspection
 - LQG Flexibility Facility Inspection
 - TSDF Flexibility Facility Inspection
- For commitment data entry procedures, see Commitment Maintenance, and Link Commitments (chapters 22, and 6) in the LearningZen CM&E Data Entry - Part 1 course.
- Step 1 is adding the number of commitments an agency has for a year, and step 2 is linking actual evaluations to the commitment.

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Not about ECHO, about RCRAInfo.

These were added to conform to the "Flexibility Implementation Guidance for the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act Compliance Monitoring Strategy" 10/17/12 memo which is posted in RCRAInfo.

Commitment use is optional, but use if your region wants you to. By Doug Nevel
