ALLERGY AWARENESS:

A letter was sent home earlier in the school year to inform parents that Cavell was an "Allergy Aware" school that is sensitive to the fact that we have students at our school with severe anaphylactic reactions to nuts. We are asking that parents please refrain from sending nuts and products containing nuts to school. We also ask our children not to share food and to wash their hands before and after eating.

I have spoken at a recent assembly about allergies and hand washing techniques. These important basic skills will continue to be stressed throughout the school. Thank you for your continued support in keeping Cavell a safe place for all our students.

Traffic Concerns:

When dropping off your children at school please ensure that you are dropping them off on the school side of the street so that they are not required to cross the street. Also make sure that students are not dropped off in the "no stopping zone" between the parking lot entrances immediately in front of the school.

The *No Child Without* program offers a free MedicAlert membership to students who attend our school. Students can continue to receive this free membership until their 14th birthday. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis then you should consider a MedicAlert membership through this program.
