### **REFERENCE DEFINITIONS:**

<u>Religious Leader:</u> Pastor, Priest, Chaplain, or Spiritual Director that the candidate has known within that context. References should be able to comment on the candidate's character, leadership, and abilities for the vocation of ministry.

<u>Field of Interest:</u> Holds a leadership position within the field of study the candidate wishes to pursue. Reference should be able to comment on the candidate's leadership and character and why this particular field of interest is well suited for the candidate.

<u>Community Leader:</u> Holds a leadership position within the community and has observed the candidate as a volunteer or an employee. References should be able to comment on the candidate's leadership and character.

<u>Academic:</u> A college or university professor from which the candidate has taken classes. The professor should be able to comment on the academic ability of the candidate.

<u>Character:</u> Co-workers, employment supervisors, friends that can comment on the candidate's character and ethics. Family members are not accepted as references.

**<u>Professional</u>**: Employment references from supervisors or managers of the candidate's employment (past or present).

**Personal:** Friends or co-workers. Family members are not accepted as references.
