Reinhardt University Campus Saturday July 19th- Thursday, July 24th

Check-In, Saturday, July 19th: at Blue/Gold/Hubbard Dorms

- 1:00 pm for Freshman
- 2:00 pm for Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors
- Parents are responsible for student's transportation to and from camp on July 19th and 24th. Students are not allowed to drive themselves or have cars at Reinhardt at any time.
- **FIRST: Drop off Instruments** Drop off instruments at The Falany Performing Arts Center *see map*. There is plenty of parking available in the adjacent parking lot. After instrument check-in, all students must proceed to Blue/Gold/Hubbard Dorm– *see map*.
- **SECOND:** Check In for Students Parents will drive student from The Falany Performing Arts Center to Blue/Gold/Hubbard *see map*. Students will come into the main entrance by the gazebo. Camp officers will be there to help direct you. There is plenty of parking available in the adjacent parking lot. Please park and unload; do not unload at the curb.

Typical Orchestra Schedule: Each day includes morning and evening rehearsals, as well as afternoon sectionals at the Falany Performing Arts Center. Chaperoned free-time activities and structured evening activities are built into the daily schedule. Evening activities are: Sat (Scavenger Hunt & Ice Cream Social), Sun (Movie Night), Mon (Trivia Night), Tues (Field Night), Wed (Dance), and Thurs (Concert).

We ask that you please join us for the Walton High School Camp Orchestra's concluding performance at the Falany Performing Arts Center, Thursday, July 24th at 7:00 pm.

Security: Reinhardt University has its own campus security in place to serve students and guest 24hrs/day, 7 days/week. Walton Students and staff will be identified by name badges worn around the neck at all times. Chaperones will be in residence with students and will accompany large groups around campus and will monitor activity sites on campus used by Walton.

How to Contact Your Student during Camp:

- If your student must leave camp for any reason, however briefly, you must check your student in/out with the Walton camp director. You must complete the form located on the orchestra website. If you plan to visit your student, please call to arrange a meeting location and receive Walton ID.

Check-Out of Dorm, Thursday, July 24th:

- **Keys and ID Badges:** All keys and lanyards will be collected by Mr. Metcalf at **morning** check-out.
- **Key Policy:** Each student will receive 1 room key. Each student is responsible for his/her own key and will be **charged \$85.00 for a lost key, as well as the \$300 re-key fee incurred for mandatory Reinhardt "lock-change policy**".
- Walton ID Policy: \$5.00 to WBOP for lost Walton Lanyard.
- Inspection: Check-out from the dorms will take place between 9:15 11:00 a.m., by grade, and luggage will be transported by vans to Falany Performing Arts Center. Student may not leave until her/his room passes inspection with area Chaperone. Chaperones must clean out their dorm rooms and turn in keys to Troy Metcalf by 11:00am. Following the afternoon dress rehearsal at Falany, there will be a picnic dinner at Falany from 5 p.m. 5:45 p.m. Concert begins at 7 p.m.
- **Student Departure:** After concert, all students will pick up their belongings from sectional rooms, take instruments, load vehicles & **depart for home directly from Falany**.

What to Bring to Camp:

- Your Instrument!!
 - o Fine-tuners on all strings! We can help put them on if you purchase them in advance.
 - o Double Bass campers must bring a stool.
- Folding music stand for sectionals, labeled with NAME
- Tennis shoes
- Comfortable summer clothing, shorts, etc.
- Outfit you don't mind getting wet or dirty (optional)
- Nicer outfit for casual dance (optional)
- Sweatshirt (air conditioning can be cool)
- Costumes/attire for Spirit Days (see Spirit Days Schedule at bottom of next page)
 - o *Note*: If outfit includes Morph suits, shorts must also be worn.
- Backpack or small duffle to carry a change of clothes or recreational items (ex: tennis racquet)
- Sunglasses, hat or visor
- Rain gear/umbrella/poncho we walk in the rain!
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellent
- Emergency and prescription medicines (bee sting kits, asthma, etc.)
- Toiletries/shower/bath caddy-soap, shampoo, etc.
- Shower shoes (community bath)
- Towels and wash cloths (2 each)
- Bedding:
 - Mattress cover/protector
 - o 2 Flat Sheets (X-long twin 80 inches)
 - o blanket
 - Or sleeping bag
 - Pillow and pillowcase
- Alarm clock
- Photo ID (upperclassman only)
- Laundry bag
- Water: Bottled water has been graciously donated for campers, but you may bring extra water if you would like to keep some in your dorm room or a reusable water bottle
- Optional Items:
 - o Camera
 - o Flashlight

- o Small fan
- Money (for campus vending machines, student center and walking trips to convenience stores and local eateries in Waleska)
- o Snacks (must be kept in a solid seal container such as Rubbermaid, Tupperware, etc.)
- o Games/Cards/Hacky sac/Summer Reading/volleyball/football/soccer ball, Tennis gear, etc.
- Decorations for room: Must use "MAGIC MOUNTS-POSTER MOUNTS" to adhere anything to the walls.

- Take I-75 N to I 575 N
- Continue north on I-575. Exit the interstate at exit 16
- Turn left at the top of the ramp onto Riverstone Parkway
- Merge right onto Marietta Hwy/Riverstone Pkwy/Hwy 140/BR5 (this road has many names)
- Turn left onto Waleska Road/Hwy140/Reinhardt College Pkwy and continue NW for almost 6 miles.
- Pass the main brick entrance to college and turn onto **Fine Arts Drive.** Drive through the parking lot and you will see the Falany Performing Arts Center on your right.
- Watch for students to direct you to instrument drop off. They will be wearing Pink T-shirts.
- After you drop off your instrument. Follow map to dorms.
