Minutes of the August 12th, 2014 Executive Board Meeting

President Michael Perry called the meeting to order at 09:30AM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of silence for our departed brothers and sisters.

Director Ed Hoes, read the roll call of officers. Absent were Keith Chrastka, John Hassenstab and Bill Marks. Excused were: Todd Louden and Greg Elliott.

Director Hoes read the minutes from the April Executive Board Meeting. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report as read. Motion carried.

Attorney's Report: Ed Pacilli reported that he was contacted by a member in regards to a politically motivated firing of a police officer in the North Shore Division. Ed turned the matter over to Attorney Robert Kartholl, an expert labor lawyer to follow up in this matter. Ed also advised the board that he has been attending various functions and fundraisers with elected officials and candidates from all political parties, making sure to get recognition for the IPA. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion passed.

Legislation Report: Director Ed Hoes introduced Mr. Limey Nargelenas, lobbyist for the ILACP, who spoke to the board about the pension bills involving the State and Downstate employees.

Finance & Contracts: Director Hoes read a report sent to him from Rob Roman, President of Investment Counsel, Inc., referencing our investments. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried

Conference Report: Hoes reported that this year's conference is set for September 19th & 20th of September at the Decatur Conference Center and Hotel, Decatur, Illinois. Registration is only \$85.00 per person and room rates are \$81.00 per night. Anyone wishing to donate prizes for the ladies or men's program, to see him Friday during registration. Death Benefit Report: Past President Jimmie Rogers reported that 41 claims were presented before the committee. 8 claims were paid out at \$400.00, and 33 claims were paid out at \$600.00 for a total of \$23,000.00. 3 claims were denied. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Constitution & By-Laws Report: Past President Jimmie Rogers reported that 1 proposed by-law change was presented before the committee. Executive Director Ed Hoes submitted a change requesting that under Article 8, Section 1-Appointment: That the Sherwood Camp Board Selection Committee be eliminated. The reason being that the camp has been closed for years. The committee voted to adopt. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Sherwood Youth Camp Board of Directors Report: Director Hoes stated that there is an on going lawsuit going on with the prospective buyer. More information will be explained at the annual conference.

Membership Report: Vice President Robert Nichols reported that he has been attending various Division meetings throughout the State, talking about membership into the Association. Nichols also stated that he has spoken with the members of the Kewanee Police Department along with the members at the Henry County Sheriff's Department. Bob asks that every Division Chairmen visit the departments within their Divisions asking their members to join this Association. Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

Special Members Report: No report

Public Relations Report: Vice President Robert Nichols reported that he received a letter from the Des Plaines Police Department submitting the names of two of their officers for the IPA Life Saving Award. The committee voted to approve that request. Bob read the report of the officers' actions to the Executive Board and a motion was made and seconded to approve the Life Saving Award for both officers. Motion carried.

Nichols also stated that he received a second letter from Mr. Patrick O'Connor asking that his son Kevin receive the IPA Life Saving Award. After checking the request, it was learned that Kevin O'Connor was not a member of the IPA in good standing, as he had not paid his dues for several years. The committee voted NOT to grant the award. The Executive Board agreed with the Awards Committee. Motion was made to accept the report as read. Motion was seconded and carried.

Shoot Committee Report: Vice President John Idleburg reported that the shoot brought in 5 New members, 4 Active renewals, 1 new Associate A member, 2 renewed Associate A members, 4 new Associate B members and 4 renewed. The total income for the shoots was \$3,046.00. Expenses for the shoot as of today's date are \$5,254.08. Past President Randy Benson stated that because the shoot program keeps losing money every year, that all of the fees in reference to the shoot be doubled starting in 2016. Benson made a motion for such. The motion was seconded and carried. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report as read. Motion carried

Law Enforcement Memorial Committee Report: Director Ed Hoes read the report submitted to him by Chairman Robert Madura. There were 3 names and four historic names added to the wall. Service was held at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. IPA President Michael Perry read the Gospel at the church. Attendance at this year's service appeared to be up from last year. Bob asks that everyone try to attend next year's memorial. A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the report as read.

Special Olympics Report: Vice President Chris Surdel reported that the Law Enforcement Torch Run is the single largest year-round fundraising event benefiting Special Olympics Illinois. The annual intrastate rely on its various fundraising projects which have two goals: to raise money and gain awareness for athletes who participate in Special Olympics Illinois. The LETR has raised nearly 28 million dollars over 27 years while increasing awareness of Special Olympics athletes and their accomplishments Chris has attended over 6 events throughout the State promoting the Special Olympics of Illinois. A motion was made, seconded to accept as read. Motion carried.

Scholarship Report: Director Ed Hoes reported that this year's scholarship applications are in the "Official Journal" and on the IPA Web-Site. Ed asked that everyone please read over the applications and deadlines.

Old Business: None

New Business: Past President Randy Benson approached the Executive Board advising them that the IPA office is in need of desperate repairs and that there is a dire need of funds needed in the everyday operating expenses of the Association. Expenses of the Association out weights the income coming into the Association. More money is going out than is coming into the IPA. Randy stated that at previous Executive Board Meetings, it was discussed of the possibility of borrowing money from the Associations Death Benefit Funds. After much discussion, Past President Benson made a motion that the Executive Director be allowed to borrow up to \$150,000.00 from the Death Benefit Funds, with the understanding that the money be paid back into the DB Account as soon as the Sherwood Youth Camp is sold. The money would be used to make repairs at the main office in Elmwood Park and for the everyday operating expenses of the Association when needed. A separate journal will be kept of the money used from the DB Account as to how the money is being spent. The motion was seconded by Past President Kearns. A vote of the motion was taken; all were in favor except Past President Jimmie Rogers, who was opposed to the motion. Motion carried.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried and the meeting closed at 12:45PM.

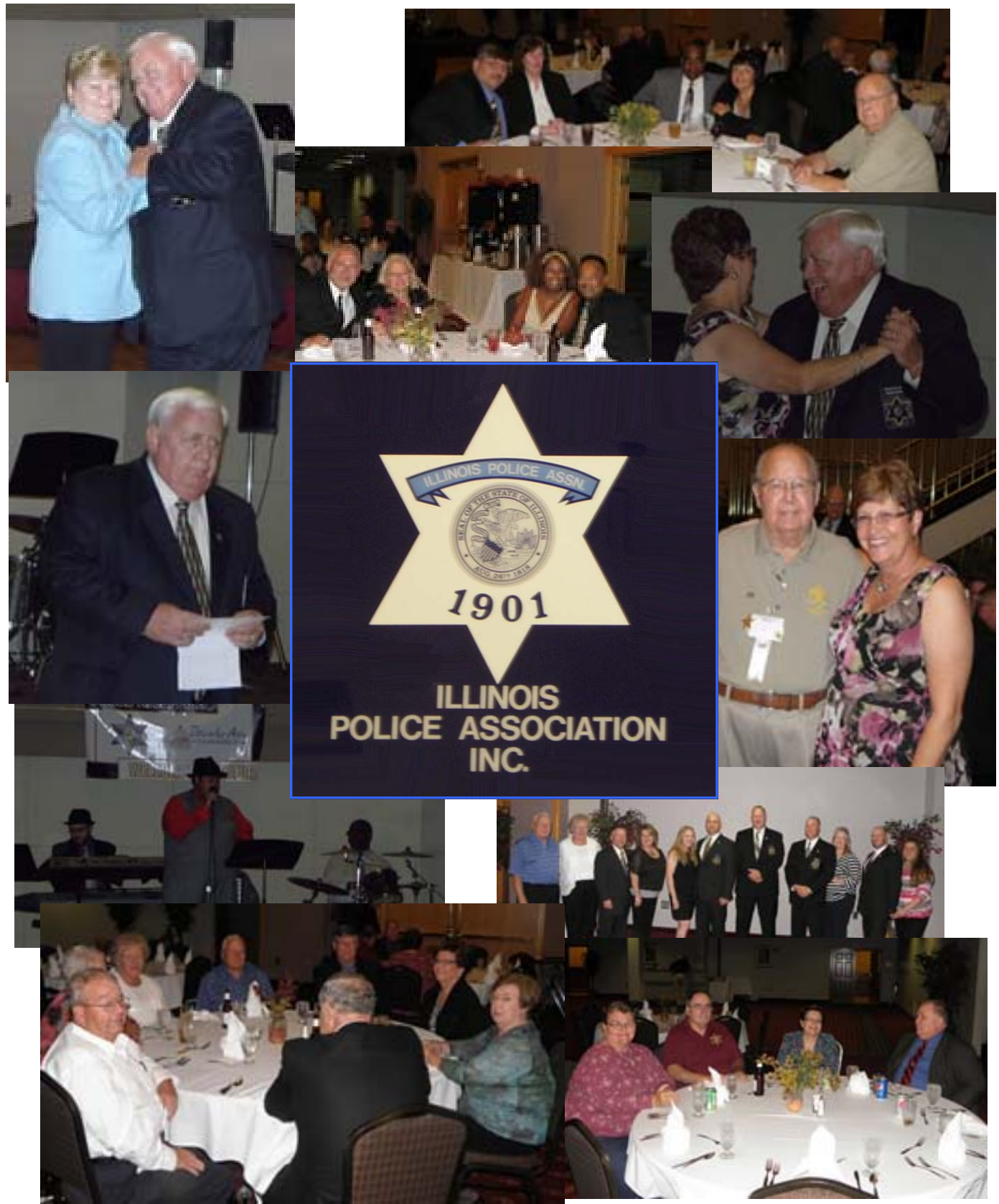

In 1994 the IPA Board decided to implement the annual scholarship award program. There were two dominant reasons for this decision:

1. To offer a recruitment incentive to prospective new members of the Illinois Police Association.
2. To reward our current members for their continued commitment and support for the organization.

On January 16, 2004, the Scholarship Committee held a meeting and reviewed the guidelines of the program. These guidelines were approved by the IPA Executive Board on April 6, 2004 to administer the program in a more efficient and effective manner for the benefit of our membership.

This information is being published to educate applicants and as a guideline for division officers during their review and processing of all required documentation.

All division chairmen will receive a copy of these guidelines and are expected to follow them to that their applicants receive proper consideration for the award. Any and all questions regarding eligibility should be directed to the corresponding division chairman. The scholarship committee of the Illinois Police Association will ultimately review all submitted applications for compliance and has the final decision regarding the awarding of scholarship funds.

The scholarship committee has worked hard to ensure the success of this ongoing program and asks that the following rules are strictly followed. Thank you for your consideration.

Eligibility:

1. A child (natural or legally adopted), regardless of residency, of an Active or Active Paid Up life member or a stepchild who resides in the same household of the IPA member. The applicant must be under the age of 24 as of November 1 of the corresponding scholarship year.
2. The member must be in good standing with the IPA for least one year prior to the date of application.
3. The scholarship applicant must be a full time student carrying a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter in an undergraduate capacity.
4. Full time nursing students who meet the above criteria are eligible to apply.

Persons who are not eligible:

1. IPA members or spouses.
2. Students in a trade, industrial or graduate school.
3. Part time students carrying less than 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter.

Eligibility will be predicated upon each division's roster of Active or Active Paid Up life members as of May 1 of the current year. No transfer of members to a different division will be made within 12 months prior to the deadline for application submissions (November 1 of each year) for the purpose of benefiting in the scholarship award program. Applicants may apply to only one division.

Scholarship Expenditures:

1. The current award will be \$500.00 per school year per student. Each eligible student in a family may apply.
2. Award winners may reapply annually.
3. The Illinois Police Association, Inc. will remit one lump sum payment of \$500.00 to award winner. The payment will be made after the division chairman submits the winning application with all necessary supplementary documentation to the IPA office. All winning applications will then be reviewed and ultimately approved by the scholarship committee.
4. Each of the 13 divisions of the IPA will receive one scholarship annually (if so submitted) at a cost to the association of \$6,500.00

Procedure for Selection:

All applications will be collected and screened by each division for eligibility and the submission of all necessary documentation. After proper verification the division board will prepare the names of all candidates for a random drawing. The winner will be drawn by the chairman at a regular meeting of the division no later than the 30th day of November in the corresponding year. The chairman will also draw the name of the one alternate winner who will not be announced.

Should the announced winner be ineligible for any reason then the alternate be awarded the scholarship and announced at a later date. Divisions should retain all submitted applications in event that the alternate is also found ineligible and yet another winner may have to be selected.

The winning application with all supportive documentation will be forwarded to the IPA office by the division secretary no later than December 15. Pending the receipt of all documentation in a timely manner, announcements of the official winners will be made by the chairman of the scholarship committee at the earliest scheduled board meeting.

If any division fails to submit the name an eligible winner no scholarship will be awarded to said division. Winners of the scholarships will be eligible to reapply the following year.

Verification of Eligibility:

The following must accompany all applications:

1. A copy of the applicant's current class schedule.
2. A copy of an invoice or statement from the bursar's office indicating full or partial tuition payment.
3. A copy or printout of a financial instrument electronic or other document showing full or partial tuition payment.

Important dead lines to remember:

- *November 1 - Application due to division chairman
- *November Division meeting -Random drawing
- *December 15 -Winning application due at IPA office
