- Plus prizes, raffles, snacks, and more!







# Changes in the Illinois library systems...

# ...What will this change mean for you the user?

This year has been a time of rapid change within the Illinois library systems due to the financial challenges in the State. As of July 1, the current nine state library systems will cease to exist and will merge into two larger systems. The Lincoln Trail Libraries System will become part of the new southern system, the Illinois Heartland Library System (IHLS), along with Shawnee Library System,



## What will this change mean for you the user?


- The Urbana Free Library will remain part of IHLS.
- You should not notice any change in service delivery—it is a change in the name and organizational structure.
- All of the library systems will remain committed to delivery and resource sharing.
- You will start seeing the IHLS name in communication you may receive from the library and through Library ELF, such as notices for holds and overdue materials.
- If you are a fan of eBooks and use **My Media Mall**, you will now select IHLS when you sign in to your account.

The library has been informed by the Lincoln Trail Libraries System that library users will gradually see changes beginning July 1. As further changes occur, the library will do its best to keep you informed.
