About the Conference

The SCBA Trust Committee is proud to announce its annual **Trust Continuing Education Conference.** Our program is designed to benefit trust department personnel at all levels. The morning will begin with a **Probate Code Update** presented by The Honorable Amy M. McCulloch, Richland County Probate Judge, S.C. Judicial Department, Columbia.

David C. Sojourner, Jr., Esq., Member of Sojourner Caughman & Thomas, LLC, Columbia, will present **South Carolina Trust Code Update.** Dave's session will provide an overview of recent changes to the South Carolina Trust Code, including options for converting existing trusts to total return unitrusts and the use of trust protectors and trust investment advisors.

Modifying Irrevocable Trusts: Trust Decanting and Court-Ordered Trust Modifications will be presented by Briani Bennett Mellen and William G. Newsome III, both of Nexsen Pruet, LLC, Columbia. They will discuss opportunities available under the South Carolina Trust Code to amend or modify irrevocable trusts. The newly updated Trust Code now allows for trust decanting, which provides the trustee with the power to distribute property to another trust for the benefit of the trust's beneficiaries. The second trust may be drafted to amend administrative provisions or address changed circumstances facing the trust or its beneficiaries. The panelists will also discuss the possibility of seeking court-ordered modifications of a trust under circumstances where decanting may not be available. Briani is a co-author of the BNA Tax Management Portfolio on Trust Decanting, No. 871, and has written for numerous trade publications on matters involving estate planning and trust administration, including the Real Property Trust and Estate Law Journal, Trusts & Estates, and Estate Planning magazine. William is a Certified Specialist in the areas of Estate Planning and Probate Law by the S.C. Supreme Court and contributing author to Estate Planning in South Carolina.

Michael W. Orange, Supervisory Examiner, CFRIS, Division of Risk Management Supervision, FDIC, Atlanta, GA, will present **Establishing an Investment Program for Trust**. Michael's session will give an overview of how to develop a good investment program for a trust department. The overview will cover prudence, the governing document, the investment policy statement, and third-partly service providers. The program will discuss management oversight of the investment program.

The conference will conclude with **Where Are We Now?** presented by Brian A. Barker, CFP, SCBT Wealth Management Group. On March 9, 2009, the S&P 500 closed at 676.53, the low point of a 16-month selloff that eroded more than half the S&P 500's value. Since then the financial markets have rebounded strongly despite a tepid economic recovery. We will review where we have been the past five years and what may be in store for the economy and the markets going forward. We hope you will take advantage of this trust learning opportunity.
