

The Ride

The Arlington 500 is a recreational bike ride on scenic roads in Lake County. You have the option of doing a 28, 42, 54 or 69 mile (**500 furlongs**) route.

The Arlington 500 is a fully supported ride. We provide:

- Cue Sheet, map and route markings
- Bike shop support at start
- Rest stops with food and beverages
- Clean toilet facilities
- Roving support vehicles on the route
- Free "Fun-Meter" pin-on button to all who pre-register.

Registration Fee

\$10.00 for pre-registration mailed before May 14, 2012. Use the form at the right. No pre-registration after May 13th please. \$15.00 on day of the ride.

Terrain

Mostly level with some moderate hills.

Your Safety

Use of a SNELL approved bicycle helmet is **mandatory** for participating in the Arlington 500 and whenever you ride.

Obey Traffic Laws and No Ear Buds

Please share the road in a courteous way with other vehicles and pedestrians. Ride single file when necessary and obey all stop signs. Police officers in communities along our route will issue citations to bicyclists who don't properly follow the rules of the road.



The Location – Barrington High School



From Chicago or the Near Northwest Suburbs

Take the Kennedy Expressway and Northwest Tollway (I-90) to Route 53. Exit on Route 53 northbound to Lake Cook Road. Continue west on Lake Cook Road (it becomes Main Street in Barrington) past Route 14 and Route 59. The High School is on Main Street about 0.6 miles west of Route 59. Turn right on Hart Road and park in the west lot.

From Western Lake County or DuPage County

Take Route 59 to Main Street in Barrington. Turn west on Main Street. The High School is on Main Street and is about 0.6 miles west of Route 59. Turn right on Hart Road and park in the west lot.

From McHenry County

Take Route 14 east to Hart Road. Turn south onto Hart Road and go 0.3 miles. The High School is on your left, park in the west lot.
