PASTORAL MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners of our Beloved Assumption,

Greetings in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

On February 2nd, the Church celebrates the Great Feast of the Presentation of the Lord to the Temple - which is in our more common terms, His 40 day blessing.

When each of us was brought to the Church for this blessing, it was so that we might be "introduced" to the Lord. It is our 1st act of offering in obedience to the Lord. Does it make sense that Jesus would need to be presented to the Lord? Is He not the Lord Himself?

This is the great irony of how we understand what is happening around us. We perceive, thus we believe. We use our human senses to draw conclusions that are not based on truth but based on our perception. This is why so many say that perception is more important than reality - which may be true in marketing, but not in the Faith.

Returning to His 40 day blessing - what is really occurring? We know that if the Temple is holy it is because the Lord is present. Jesus is not sanctified by going to the Temple, it is the Temple that is sanctified by Him, specifically, Simeon who is waiting for his arrival - for it was revealed to Simeon 3 centuries earlier that he would not die until he put his eyes upon the Savior.

Therefore, to the unknowing, it looks as though Christ is being presented to Simeon, when in fact, Simeon is being presented to Christ; it looks as though Christ is presented to be sanctified by the Temple when it is He who is sanctifying the Temple by His presence.

Let us not be like those who think they understand because their eyes have

"seen," when in fact their eyes don't have the ability to comprehend. Let us present ourselves that He may be presented to us.

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD



Commemorated February 2

When the most pure Mother and Ever-Virgin Mary's forty days of purification had been fulfilled, she took her first-born Son to Jerusalem on this, the fortieth day after His birth, that she might present Him in the temple according to the Law of Moses, which teaches that every first-born male child be dedicated to God,

and also that she might offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons, as required by the Law (Luke 2:22-24; Exod. 13:2; Lev. 12:6-8). On this same day, a just and devout man, the greatly aged Symeon, was also present in the temple, being guided by the Holy Spirit. For a long time, this man had been awaiting the salvation of God, and he had been informed by divine revelation that he would not die until he beheld the Lord's Christ. Thus, when he beheld Him at that time and took Him up into his aged arms, he gave glory to God, singing: "Now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace, O Master. . ." And he confessed that he would close his eyes joyfully, since he had seen the Light of revelation for the nations and the Glory of Israel (Luke 2:25-32). From ancient times, the Holy Church has retained this tradition of the churching of the mother and new-born child on the fortieth day and of the reading of prayers of purification.

St. Theodore the Commander



Commemorated February 8

The holy Martyr Theodore was from Euchaita of Galatia and dwelt in Heraclea of Pontus. He was a renowned commander in the military, and the report came to the Emperor Licinius that he was a Christian and abominated the idols. Licinius therefore sent certain men to him from Nicomedia. to honor him and ask him to appear before Through them, however, Saint him. Theodore sent back a message that it was necessary for various reasons, that Licinius come to Heraclea. Licinius, seeing in this a hope of turning Saint Theodore away from Christ did as was asked of him.

When the Emperor came to Heraclea, Saint Theodore met him with honor, and the Emperor in turn gave Theodore his hand, believing that through him he would be able to draw the Christians to the worship of his idols. Seated upon his throne in the midst of the people, he publicly bade Theodore offer sacrifice to the gods. But Theodore asked that the emperor entrust him with the most venerable of his gods, those of gold and silver, that he might take them home and himself attend upon them that evening, promising that the following day he would honor them in public. The Emperor, filled with joy at these tidings, gave command that Theodore's request be fulfilled.

When the Saint had taken the idols home, he broke them in pieces and distributed the gold and silver to the poor by night. The next day a centurion named Maxentius told Licinius that he had seen a pauper pass by carrying the head of Artemis. Saint Theodore, far from repenting of this, confessed Christ boldly. Licinius, in an uncontainable fury, had the Saint put to many torments, then crucified. While upon the cross, the holy Martyr was further tormented -- his privy parts were cut off, he was shot with arrows, his eyes were put out, and he was left on the cross to die. The next day Licinius sent men to take his corpse and cast it into the sea; but they found the Saint alive and perfectly whole. Through this, many believed in Christ. Seeing his own men turning to Christ, and the city in an uproar, Licinius had Theodore beheaded, about the year 320. The Saint's holy relics were returned to his ancestral home on June 8, which is also a feast of the Great Martyr Theodore.

Δημοκρατία: Η δημοκρατία είναι το πολίτευμα όπου η εξουσία πηγάζει από τον λαό, ασκείται από τον λαό και υπηρετεί τα συμφέροντα του λαού. Κεντρικό χαρακτηριστικό της δημοκρατίας είναι η λήψη αποφάσεων με ψηφοφορία: των πολιτών, στην άμεση δημοκρατία, ή κάποιων αντιπροσώπων τους, στην αντιπροσωπευτική δημοκρατία.

Democracy: Democracy is a political system where the power comes from the people, exercised by the people and serves the interests of the people. A central feature of democracy is to make decisions by voting: citizens, in direct democracy, or some of their representatives in representative democracy.

Cleisthenes, (born *c*. 570 bc—died *c*. 508), statesman regarded as the founder of Athenian democracy, serving as chief archon (highest magistrate) of the city-state (525–524). Cleisthenes successfully allied himself with the popular Assembly against the nobles (508) and imposed democratic reform. Perhaps his most important innovation was the basing of individual political responsibility on citizenship of a place rather than on membership in a clan.

SACRAMENTS AND BLESSINGS

BLESSINGS OF INFANTS – There are 3 designated times to offer prayers for a newborn child; on the 1st day, the 8th day (naming of the child) and on the 40th day (40 days after birth, a child and its mother come to church to receive a 40 Day Blessing, as Christ Himself was presented in the Temple 40 days after He was born). Please call Fr. Jon to arrange each of these blessings.

BAPTISMS — Please call the church office to schedule Baptisms. It is important to plan ahead as there are some days when Baptisms are not permitted. Please know that a child is given only one name at baptism and there is only one Godparent of record.

WEDDINGS—Please arrange an appointment with Fr. Jon at least 6 months prior to the proposed wedding date to allow time for all necessary premarital preparation.

CONFESSION—Confessions are arranged by appointment. Please call the church office to schedule Confession.

VISITATION OF THE SICK / HOMEBOUND – Orthodox Christians who would like to receive Holy Sacraments but are unable to attend church (hospitalized or at home) should contact the church office so Holy Sacraments can be administered to them.

If your loved one is hospitalized, please inform the church office. Most hospitals no longer inform the parish when our parishioners are admitted; and, those that do, are not timely.

MEMORIAL / TRISAGION SERVICES— Memorial/Trisagion Services are offered for the eternal rest of persons who have fallen asleep in the Lord. Memorial Services are offered for Orthodox Christians who were in good canonical standing only. Trisagion Services can be offered for anyone. There are some days when Memorials/Trisagia are not permitted – please call the church office to schedule a Memorial/ Trisagion service

Customarily, Memorials take place at 40 days, at 6 months, at 1 year and at 3 years. After three years have passed, the departed are more properly remembered on the Saturdays of the Souls.

SIN AND EVIL

Taken from "The Prologue from Ochrid" (February 10th) Many of the weighty difficulties which befall man have their cause, known or unknown, in his past. However, the causes of these weighty difficulties, let us say mental disorder, are nothing else than the transgression of the moral law of God.

When St. Haralambos was being tortured, the persecuting emperor found out about his miracle-working power and ordered an insane man to be brought to Haralambos so that the emperor could be convinced that Haralambos could heal him. The devil tormented this man for thirty-five years driving him into the wilderness and hills and hurling him into mud or into gorges. When this deranged person approached Haralambos, the demon sensed a sweet-smelling fragrance emanating from this holy man and shouted: "I beg you, O servant of God, do not torment me before my time, rather command me and I will depart and, if you wish, I will tell you how it came about that I entered into this man." The saint commanded the demon to relate the story. The demon said: "This man wanted to steal from his neighbor and thought to himself: 'If I don't kill the man first, I will not be able to seize his goods.' He proceeded and killed his neighbor. Having caught him in the act, I entered him and behold for thirty-four years I dwelt in him." Upon hearing this, the saint of God commanded the demon to depart from the man immediately and to leave him in peace. The demon departed and the demented man was restored to health and became tranquil.

The Prologue from Ochrid contains short accounts of the lives of major saints for each day, as well as homily, something "for consideration", and points to ponder from Old Testament readings.
