DAY TWO Syracuse

Upon arrival, transfer by deluxe motor coach to **Syracuse** and the *Hotel des Etrangers et Miramare* on Syracuse's island of Ortygia. (*Provided for Air Program participants only.*)

DAY THREE SYRACUSE

Educational Focus: *A Country Within a Country.* Strategically located between Europe and Africa, Sicily has long been the crossroad of many civilizations. As a result, Sicily's culture and history are unique from the Italian mainland.

Excursion: *Magnificent Syracuse*.

Explore the Old Town, a showcase of architecture between the medieval and baroque eras, and the Piazza del Duomo, one of Sicily's most elegant squares. Continue to Archaeological Park to see the ancient ruins.

Independent Exploration: Lunch and the afternoon are at your leisure.

Local Flavor: Dinner is served at a familyowned trattoria.

DAY FOUR

MOUNT ETNA & TAORMINA Educational Focus and Excursion:

The Friendly Giant. Mount Etna, one of the world's most active volcanoes, is the



tallest in Europe, rising 10,958 feet above sea level. Etna is known as the "friendly giant" because people are rarely harmed during its eruptions. Ascend Etna to a vantage point where several of the volcano's craters can be viewed.

Local Flavor: *An Italian Lemon Farm.* The soil around Mount Etna is very fertile. Enjoy lunch at a farmhouse restaurant on the slope of the volcano. Learn about the workings of the farm, which grows lemons used in making *limoncello*.

Excursion: *Taormina.* Settled by the Greeks in the sixth century B.C., Taormina blossomed in the Middle Ages and is home to 14th- and 15th-century palaces. Taormina's most famous monument is a Greek theater, rebuilt by the Romans in about A.D. 200. The theater still is used today because of its near-perfect acoustics.

Day Five Noto

Excursion: *Noto.* In 1693, an earthquake ravaged about 60 towns in the southeastern corner of Sicily. Noto, rebuilt six miles away from its original location, became one of a group of towns noted for its Sicilian baroque architecture. Local architects combined traditional Sicilian elements with the fashionable baroque architecture of the time to create a unique style.

Independent Exploration: The afternoon and evening are at your leisure.

Day Six Piazza Armerina & Agrigento

This morning, depart for **Palermo** and the *Excelsior Hilton Palermo*.



Syracuse (2005), the Late Baroque Town of Noto (2002), the Romana Villa del Casale (1997) and the Archaeological Area of Agrigento (1997) are UNESCO World Heritage *List* sites featured in this program. These sites are distinguished due to universal scenic, historic, artistic or scientific value.

Excursion: Roman Mosaics and Greek Temples. The Villa Romana del Casale, a fourth-century country house near Piazza Armerina, is home to some of the best mosaics of the Roman Empire. The monuments in Agrigento's Valley of the Temples were built in the late sixth century B.C. The Temple of Concord is one of the most spectacular surviving Doric temples.

Local Flavor: Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant during this excursion.

Educational Focus: Sicily in World War

II. Examine the events of Operation Husky, the World War II battle in which more than 160,000 Allied troops landed on Sicily's southeastern beaches.

DAY SEVEN PALERMO Educational Focus: The Cosa Nostra.

Excursion: Palermo, the Sicilian Capital. Palermo's Cathedral is a harmonious blend of Gothic, Moorish and Norman architecture. See the Palatine Chapel in the Norman Palace; its resplendent mosaics combine Islamic motifs and Christian iconography. The Islamic-influenced domes of St. John of the Hermits, a 12th-century Norman church, are built on the grounds of a mosque. A tour of a market reveals the bounty of the land and sea.

Local Flavor: Enjoy lunch at a restaurant in Palermo.

Excursion: The Mosaics of Monreale. Like many of Sicily's churches, the Santa Maria la Nuova is composed of many architectural styles. However, most people come to look at its mosaics, which cover 68,243 square feet (6,340 square meters).

DAY EIGHT ERICE & SEGESTA

Excursion: Elymian Erice. Erice's Duomo is a Romanesque masterpiece. The town also features two medieval castles.

Cultural Event: Olive Farm—Meet the

People. Enjoy lunch at an olive farm. This family operation produces award-winning

organic olive oil, and a member of the family will lead a guided tour of the facilities and explain the process of making olive oil.

Excursion: *Segesta*. Ancient Segesta is home to a Doric temple, spectacular though unfinished, and an amphitheater carved into the rock of Mount Barbaro.

Day Nine Cefalù

Educational Focus: Contemporary

Sicily. Discuss Sicily's current issues and examine its geopolitical role within Italy and the European Union.

Excursion: *Cefalù*. Cefalù, a pretty fishing village, is anchored between the Tyrrhenian Sea and a limestone promontory. Its highlights include a 12th-century Romanesque cathedral regarded as one of the greatest churches in southern Europe. Flanked by two towers, the interior houses remarkable remnants of Byzantine mosaics.

Independent Exploration: The afternoon is at leisure.

Tonight, gather with fellow travelers for a *Farewell Reception and Dinner* and *Graduation Ceremony* in the hotel.

DAY TEN

Transfer by motor coach from the hotel to the airport in Catania for the flight to Germany, where you'll overnight at a deluxe hotel. (*Provided for Air Program participants only.*)

DAY ELEVEN

Embark the return trans-Atlantic flight to your gateway city. (*Provided for Air Program participants only.*)


