TODAY'S MEETING

Lt. Bruno Riboni - Seabees in the Sand

Willis Alt introduced Bruno P. Riboni, Vice President and Portfolio Manager with 1st Source Bank. Bruno's situation is a little different from other bankers because of his involvement as an active naval reservist.

Lt. Bruno Riboni, Assistant Logistics Officer described the activities of his Seabees unit in Iraq from February 2008 – September 2008. His reserve unit the Naval Construction Force Support Unit (NCFSU) was called to active duty to provided construction, engineering, logistics, and specialized equipment support. The Seabees provided responsive military construction support to Navy, Marine Corps, and other forces in Iraq's military operations.

As the Assistant Logistics Officer for the Regiment his duties change from day to day. Some of his routine tasks were contracting materials and services in support of the Regiment and keeping the SUPPO informed of all the moving parts. In addition to standard wood, steel, masonry, and concrete construction, NMCBs also perform specialized construction such as water well drilling and battle damage repair. They were able to work and defend themselves at construction sites outside of their base camp and convoy through unsecured areas.

Lt. Riboni closed the meeting showing several pictures of the Iraq construction sites his unit worked on and answering questions.


