<u>From I-35 north</u>, take the Lake Ave exit downtown. Go north, up the hill, to 1<sup>st</sup> St. Turn left onto 1<sup>st</sup> St and go just over two blocks. Shortly after you cross 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave West, turn left into the Holiday Inn parking ramp.

<u>From Wisconsin</u>, go to Superior. Take Hwy 53 (closest) or Hwy 2 across either bridge to Duluth and get onto I-35 North. Follow directions above.

<u>From Hwy 53 North</u>, follow the Miller Trunk Hwy straight through the mall area and stay on Central Entrance. (Don't follow Hwy 53 when it turns right.) Turn right onto Mesaba Ave at the stop light near the Coppertop Church.

Take the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave West ramp right, off of Mesaba. Go down the hill and turn right onto 1<sup>st</sup> St. Turn left into the Holiday Inn parking ramp.

<u>Parking</u>: You can park in the ramp and pay the fee, or find an unmetered spot on 4<sup>th</sup> St or above. You may need to move your car every couple hours.
