Purpose: Clinical training in hand management and patient care, including pre- and post- operative assessment, treatment planning, splinting, return-to-work programs and outcomes.

Training Expectations: The fellow will be expected to: 1) attend six surgical procedures, post operative follow-ups and rehabilitation sessions, 2) attend and participate at a weekly hand therapy educational meeting, 3) initiate/complete a case report for submission to the Journal of Hand Therapy.

Time Period: Full-time, six month fellowship from July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015, or January 2, 2016 through June 30, 2016.

Eligibility Requirements: Applicant must be a graduate of an accredited occupational or physical therapy program (bachelor's or master's degree), licensed, have a minimum of one year clinical experience preferably in the area of upper extremity rehabilitation. Applicants will be selected based on their demonstrated interest in the specialty of hand rehabilitation and their desire to advance their therapeutic skill in hand management. Preference will be given to applicants who evidence financial need and/or will practice in an underserved area.

Behavioral Objectives: A detailed set of 51 behavioral learning objectives has been established to guide the Fellow's learning experience.
