

Day 1 Oct. 30 Departs USA

Today you will depart from the USA to **Amman**, **Jordan**. Meals served in flight.

Day 2 Oct. 31 Arrive in Amman

Arrive in **Amman** and be transferred to your hotel for check-in, dinner and a good night's sleep.

Day 3 Nov. 1 Mt. Nebo, Border Crossing, Qumran, Dead Sea Swim, Jericho, Jordan Valley

Visit Mt. Nebo, where Moses viewed the Promised Land (Deuteronomy 34) before he died. On a clear day you will have an inspiring, breath-taking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the rooftops of Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Cross the border into Israel and continue to Qumran, site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery, to discuss the mysterious community of the Essenes who once lived on the shores of the Dead Sea. Stop at the Dead Sea, the lowest spot on earth, where those who desire may take a quick dip in the mineral-laden waters. From Jericho, you can see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus (Matt. 4). Even today, the road from Jericho to Jerusalem twists for miles as it climbs from below sea level into the Judean mountains. Jesus traveled the nearby Roman road, the setting of His parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10). Travel through the Jordan River Valley, the route often taken by Jesus and other Galileans as they traveled to and from Jerusalem. Continue to the Galilee area for check-in to your hotel, dinner and overnight.

Day 4 Nov. 2 Mt. of Beatitudes, Tabgha, Capernaum, Boat Ride, St. Peter's Fish Lunch, Baptismal Service in Jordan River


Visit the peaceful **Mount of Beatitudes** that overlooks the Sea of Galilee. On this hill, Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7). Stop at **Tabgha**, where the feeding of the 5,000 is remembered at the **Church of the Loaves and Fish** (Luke 9). Travel to **Capernaum**, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilee. Visit the synagogue that stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom (Matt. 4). Enjoy a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee and appreciate the special place this lake had in Jesus' ministry. Enjoy a **St. Peter's Fish lunch** at the Ein Gev kibbutz. End the day with a stop at the **Jordan River** for a time of spiritual blessing.

This itinerary is subject to changes in sequence of days, local conditions, and preferences of the tour leader.

Day 5 Nov. 3 Nazareth Annunciation Church, Cana, Mt. Carmel, Haifa Promenade, Megiddo, Jaffa City and Port, Simon the Tanner's House, Jerusalem

Visit Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus (Matt. 2). Recall Jesus' first miracle as you pass through Cana (John 2). Look across the Valley of Jezreel to the heights of Mount Carmel. On this mount, Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). See the beautiful Haifa Promenade. Afterwards, travel the ancient caravan route as you pass by Tel Megiddo where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Continue to Jaffa City and Port. View Simon the Tanner's House before arriving at your hotel in Jerusalem. Check-in to your hotel and enjoy dinner before turning in for the night.



Stand atop the **Mount of Olives** as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem. Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives (Acts 1). Walk down **Palm Sunday Road** and take time to pray in the **Garden of Gethsemane** (John 18). Here you can see olive trees that date back to the time of Christ. On Mount Zion, stand in the **Upper Room**, near the traditional site of the Last Supper (Mark 14). Walk through some of the ancient rooms of **Caiaphas' the High Priest's house** beneath the **Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu.** Here, it is believed by many, Jesus was held overnight before His crucifixion (Luke 22). Explore the **Southern Wall Excavations**, including the **Hulda Steps** and the many **Mikvahs** at the foot of the steps.

Day 7 Nov. 5 Western Wall, St. Anne's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Via Dolorosa, Jewish and Christian Quarters, Sisters of Zion Church

Touch a part of Herod's Temple as you pray at the **Western Wall**. Sing a chorus in **St. Anne's Church** and marvel at its amazing acoustics. Nearby, view the **Pool of Bethesda** (John 5) where Jesus performed the Sabbath miracle. Walk the **Via Dolorosa**, "the Way of the Cross." Experience the **Old City** and enjoy the preserved, ancient culture found in the narrow streets of the **Jewish and Christian Quarters**. Visit the **Lithostrotos** at the Convent of the **Sisters of Zion**. This area of pavement constructed with large slabs is associated with the condemnation of Jesus by Pilate (John 19). The pavement also has a Roman "King's Game" board carved into it to use for a dice game that recalls the casting of lots for Jesus' clothing after His crucifixion (John 19).

Day 8 Nov. 6 Bethlehem (Church of Nativity), Shepherd's Field, Ein Karem, Elah Valley, Garden Tomb

Cross the border into **Bethlehem**, the birthplace of Jesus (Luke 2). Enter the **Church of the Nativity**, the oldest continuously functioning church in the world. See the cave where tradition holds Jesus was born. Look out on the **Shepherd's Fields**, where angels spread the Good News. Continue to **Ein Karem**, traditionally known as the birthplace of John the Baptist, and where tradition holds that Mary journeyed to share with Elizabeth her good news (Luke 1). Journey through the **Valley of Elah** where David defeated Goliath (I Samuel 17). Finally, sense the agony of Christ's crucifixion at **Gordon's Calvary** (Luke 23) and experience the exhilaration and reality of the resurrection at the **Garden Tomb**. At the end of your time in the Holy Land, we prepare for our return journey to the USA.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

CANCELLATION FEES:
