

2010 North Dakota Winter Show Cattle Rules and Regulations

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- **Entry Deadlines.** All entries must be postmarked by February 15, 2010. Entry fee: \$15 plus \$10 bedding per animal. **Late entry fee:** \$25 plus \$10 bedding per animal. **Late entries accepted** until Noon, Saturday, March 6. **Substitutions:** \$10 per substitution.
- **Registered Cattle.** All cattle entries must be registered, except Junior Steer, Junior Commercial Heifers. Grand Commercial Heifers will be eligible to run for the Supreme Heifer in the Junior Show.
- **Ring Steward.** Each breed will be required to have their own ring steward for the Junior show.
- **Call to Ring.** Each individual will be called once and only once to the ring for their show. If they are not in the ring after one call, they will be disqualified.
- **Fitting Rules.** Breed association rules apply for fit or no-fit shows. See your breed secretary for rules.
- **Arrival Time.** Livestock will not be permitted to unload from trucks/trailers nor will any stalls be assigned before 8 am Friday, March 5. *(Stalls and tie-outs will not be available prior to this, due to horse events on Thursday).* Exhibitors are required to carry their own liability insurance.
- **Arrival Deadline.** All animals must be checked in by Saturday, March 6 at 5 pm.
- **Check In.** All exhibitors will check in at the Livestock Office, located in the west end of the Main Building **upon arrival**. Please check with Livestock Office for trailer parking locations. Original registration papers or copy of application, and health papers (if needed) will be checked at this time. Animals without registration papers will be shown in the "Other Breeds" classes. Health regulations are listed separately.
- **Stalling.** All livestock entered in the North Dakota Winter Show are entitled to a stall in the Winter Show Event Center. Authority is given to the NDWS management to stall cattle as they see fit. Failure of anyone to abide by the rules and regulations will result in dismissal from the show with no refund of entry and bedding fees. Efforts must be made to insure that stalls are kept as clean as possible. No hay or feed can be stored behind livestock because of fire rules and regulations. All cleaning is to be done by 8 am
- **Tie Outs.** Tie outs are bedded with straw. The exhibitor may pick their own tie outs.
- **Bedding.** All stalls will be bedded before you arrive. Extra chips and hay will be available for purchase at the Livestock Office. Hay and straw brought into the WS building are subject to random inspection for noxious weeds.
- **Livestock Fans.** Butt fans are not allowed.
- **Exhibitor Liability & Ethics.** Upon entering the NDWS shows, the exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the North Dakota Winter Show Holding Company, the North Dakota Winter Show, its directors, officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, losses, costs or expenses, including attorney's fees arising in whole or in part out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions of you, your agents or invitees. All livestock exhibited in this show will be entirely at the owner's risk. Presentation of the entry blank shall be deemed acceptance of these rules and the IAFE Code of Ethics, a copy of which is on file at the NSC office.
- **Brand Inspection.** "No person shall remove cattle from this state or within a mile of any boundary of the state unless such livestock shall be inspected for marks and brands by an official brand inspector of the ND Stockmen's Association. A certificate of inspection to accompany livestock to its destination will be provided by a State Brand Inspector at the Winter Show Event Center. All cattle are subject to mouthing to verify the animal age."
- **Release.** *Animals will be released at 2 pm on Sunday, March 7, 2010.*
- **Copies.** A copier is available at the main office at a price of 10 cents per copy. Local faxes will cost \$1.00 per page.
- **Bulls.** All bulls over 12 months of age will be required to have nose rings. There is no age limit on bulls.

CLIPPING / BLOCKING CHUTE REGULATIONS:

- The designated area for clipping chutes provides an opportunity for the spectators to view the livestock without climbing around chutes and debris. Therefore, the following rules will apply to all clipping and/or blocking chutes used during the NSC.
- A special area will be set aside for clipping and/or blocking chutes. Such chutes will not be allowed in any other area unless specifically authorized by NDWS management. **The barn crew will remove chutes not in the designated area.**
- There is a \$10.00 charge for each chute brought into the Show buildings.
- **If you desire to have a clipping chute or blocking chute in the building, complete the application at the bottom of livestock entry form.**
- Chutes must be removed immediately upon completion of the respective shows and sales.
- Bedding will be in place when you arrive at the NDWS. If you desire to use more bedding, you will be able to purchase it at the NDWS.

JUNIOR SHOW:

- **Junior Showmanship.** Showmanship classes will be held at 7:30 am for all interested juniors. Register at the Livestock Office to participate. A jacket award will be presented to the Overall Grand Champion Livestock Handlers in the Junior (12 & under), Intermediate (13-16) and Senior (17-21) divisions.
- The North Dakota Winter Show Junior Show is an **open show**. No minimum exhibitor age and ND residency is not a requirement. Exhibitors in the junior shows must meet the eligibility requirements of their respective national junior breed associations. For those breeds not governed by association rules, those juniors will be allowed to show through the calendar year that they turn 21 years of age. This show is sanctioned by the North Dakota Junior Point Show Association and show results and points towards awards will be submitted for Point Show members. Contact Jackie Buckley, NDSU, 210 2nd Ave NW, Mandan ND 58554, 701-667-3340, for membership, points and awards information. Junior Point Show applications are available at the Livestock Office.
- Membership in the NDJPSA is not required to participate in this show. Bulls do not qualify for point show program, but may be entered in the NDWS Junior Show.
- **Animals** must be in the name of the junior or family, with date of ownership on or before January 1, to be shown in the North Dakota Winter Show.
- If NDWS Management sees a junior exhibitor is incapable of showing an unruly animal, the NDWS Management has the right to tie the animal or escort it from the ring.
- **North Star Classic Comeback Show.** As an added incentive for juniors to purchase cattle at NSC sales, juniors are encouraged to bring that animal back to the show at the Sunday, March 7, 2010 NDWS Junior Show. Added premium money is available for this Show with no entry fee required.

FEE SCHEDULE: THERE ARE NO REFUNDS.

Late entries are taken from February 15 until March 6 at NOON at North Dakota Winter Show.

Junior Show. \$15 per entry. \$25 late entry fee.

Bedding Fee: Pay one-time \$10 bedding fee per head.

Substitutions: \$20 additional fee per animal in both junior and open shows.

2010 North Dakota Winter Show Cattle Health Regulations

The North Dakota Winter Show requires that all cattle meet health requirements before being permitted in the Show Building. All animals are subject to inspection by the Show veterinarian upon arrival at the NDWS. These regulations have been verified as of January 21, 2010. Please contact the state vet, 701-328-2655, for further information and most up-to-date regulations.

All Cattle:

All cattle must be free of contagious disease and parasites, including ringworm, warts, mange, lice and pinkeye.

All sale cattle leaving North Dakota need a new health certificate to leave the state, this will be provided by the veterinarian at sale.

Show cattle from North Dakota:

1. Health certificates are not required for show cattle if they originate in ND and return to the premises of origin.
2. All **show cattle** females over six months of age must be brucellosis vaccinated prior to arrival at the NDWS.*

Show cattle from outside North Dakota:

All health certificates will be shown to the livestock secretary.

1. Importation Permits, obtained by calling ND State Board of Animal Health, 701-328-2655
2. Certificates of veterinary inspection
3. Official individual identification is required on all sexually intact cattle. **MN Cattle Requirement:** All MN cattle, including steers, spayed heifers, and sexually intact cattle need official individual identification.
4. Brucellosis: Vaccination required for all female cattle over 6 months of age.*
5. Trichomonas foetus: Please see the enclosed Trichomonas foetus testing waiver form on out-of-state bulls that are planning to attend the NSC. The request must be made prior to the NSC and approved by the state vet.
6. Tuberculosis: Required testing for all cattle coming from states not accredited tuberculosis free (i.e. Minnesota) will be in accordance with the ND Board of Animal Health regulations. ***As of time of printing, North Dakota does not recognize the split state status. North Dakota requires a whole herd test within 12 months and an individual test within 60 days prior to entry.*** Please refer to attached sheet for more details. **For more information contact: ND State Board of Animal Health, 701-328-2655. ORDER
Order No. 2008-01

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, *effective immediately*, the State Board of Animal Health has determined that there is a threat from tuberculosis (TB) in imported cattle, bison, goats, farmed cervids, and camelids from Minnesota.

- Importation permit obtained prior to entry into North Dakota.
- All cattle, bison, goats, farmed cervids, and camelids must be individually officially identified and be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection.

AND

- All cattle, bison, goats, farmed cervids, and camelids must originate from a herd which has had a whole herd negative TB test within 12 months prior to shipment and have a negative individual TB test within 60 days (for cattle, bison, camelids, and goats) or 90 days (for farmed cervids) prior to shipment into ND. If the herd test was within 60 days (cattle, bison, camelids, and goats) or 90 days (farmed cervids), no additional individual animal testing is required.

OR

- All cattle, bison, goats, farmed cervids, and camelids must originate from a TB accredited free herd which has had a whole herd negative TB test within six months

OR

- All cattle, bison, goats, farmed cervids, and camelids which originate from a TB accredited free herd which has not had a negative whole herd TB test within 6 months prior to shipment into ND must also have a negative individual TB test within 60 days (for cattle, bison, camelids, and goats) or 90 days (for farmed cervids) prior to shipment.

Young animals are considered test-eligible at 60 days of age.

- Animals less than 60 days of age must originate from a TB accredited free herd which has had a negative whole herd test within 6 months prior to importation.

OR


- Young animals (less than 60 days of age) are exempt from the test requirement, if accompanying a TB negative tested dam that is from a herd with a TB negative whole herd test within 12 months.

The only exceptions to this Order will be by approval of the State Veterinarian based upon an epidemiological evaluation and risk determination.

This Order is issued pursuant to NDCC §36-01-08 and §36-01-12. The State Veterinarian is directed to carry out this Order pursuant to NDCC §36-01-06. This Order remains in effect until further notice.

Board Order 2005-01 – Tuberculosis Testing of Imported Beef Cattle, Bison, and Goats from Minnesota is hereby rescinded effective 2-21-08.
