# From Rabbi Cantor



he leader breaks the middle matzah, and wraps one half in a napkin... - Haggadah

Lately, I've been thinking about *Yachatz*, that little ritual at the beginning of the

seder (after we eat the green *Karpas*) when a sheet of matzah is broken in two. *Yachatz* is far from the flashiest part of the seder; it involves action only by the leader and is unaccompanied by even a single word. And yet, this year at least, *Yachatz* clamors for my attention. Maybe because this year I feel a bit broken myself, having literally broken my ankle and fibula a month ago. But mostly because this is my first Passover without my mother.

My mother, Marion Bassett Cantor, z"l, absolutely loved Pesach. And her excitement spread to the rest of us, despite the fact that it was so much work to get ready. In the days before we had a dishwasher (which spanned my entire childhood), it seemed to take days to wash and dry those green glass Pesach dishes which my father brought up from the basement. Then came the trips to the Crown to buy all the special food. Which was followed by cleaning and polishing and vacuuming and dusting (including all the woodwork and ledges). Finally, we set up the long folding tables which spanned the living room. My mother would cook and we were her *sous chefs*, rinsing and chopping and helping as she prepared our Pesach favorites. She was a great, inventive and intuitive cook. We set out the plates and bowls and cups, the wineglasses and pitchers, the seder plates and the *haggadahs*. We brought in bunches of forsythia from the yard, stuck them in vases, and awaited our guests.

Our seders - whether at our home, at my grandparents' house in New Haven, or with our cousins - were always lively and participatory. We used the Maxwell House Haggadah for years, and later bought fancy Haggadot, which were artistically designed and full of "meaningful" readings. No matter the book we used, there was always a great deal of singing and laughter. After the kids sang the Four Questions, my mother would chant them to the Talmudic tune she had learned as a girl in yeshiva. And there were serious moments as well: my mother always told us the story of the revolt of the Warsaw Ghetto, which had begun on the eve of Passover. At the conclusion of the seder, we didn't stop at Chad Gadyo and Adir Hu; we belted out Zionist songs my mother had learned in Junior Mizrachi, along with labor songs and old Negro spirituals.



Of course, we are grateful that God has kept us in life and enabled us to celebrate Passover. But as we look around the table, we recall who is missing, and know that we are not entirely whole. That's what *Yachatz* is about. There's always some brokenness, even (perhaps, especially) in the midst of celebration. Acknowledging this, we quietly break the *matzah* in half. The seder cannot proceed until we do so. The act of breaking is deceptively simple. For while it separates and destroys, it also enables rebuilding, making way for growth, for healing, for transformation. Every seder moves in this direction. From slavery to freedom, from darkness to light, from sorrow to joy. As the great Leonard Cohen sings: "There is a crack, a crack in everything; that's how the light gets in."

May Pesach this year bring renewed meaning to our lives. May our seder experience uplift us and strengthen our commitment to work towards a better world. May God bring us all out of *Mitzrayim* once again. And may our memories be sweet. Have a *zissen* Pesach.

#### BRINGING BIKUR CHOLIM TO THE BTS COMMUNITY

You hear that one of our members is ill, recuperating, homebound, experiencing the loss of a loved one, isolated, or otherwise in distress. What can you do to help? It's called *Bikur Cholim*. In Hebrew, that translates to visiting the sick, but it more generally means taking care of one another.

The act of Bikur Cholim is a *mitzvah*, a moral and spiritual act that is an important part of being a Jew. By joining this "*mitzvah* brigade," we enrich our lives and the lives of those to whom we connect, whether that link is made through a visit, a card, a phone call, or a meal.

Join our team—by adding your name to a list of volunteers we can call upon, whether once in awhile or more frequently, the amount of time you devote to *Bikur Cholim* is up to you. To volunteer your services, call or e-mail Jean Vitale or Barbara Katzman— e-mails and phone numbers below.

Here are just some of things you can do as part of our team:

- Phone a homebound senior or shut-in before Shabbat or a holiday.
- Bring food to a family in their time of need, whether ill, in mourning, or otherwise needing that bit of extra help.

- Send a card to brighten someone's day, let him/her know he/she is remembered for whatever the person is going through.
- Visit a patient at home, in a hospital, or nursing home.



# **SELLING OF HAMETZ**

The final step in preparing home for Passover, after providing for Passover food and changing over to Passover dishes, is selling non-Passover food and utensils that remain in the home. This includes all premises, including vacation homes, places of business, and dormitory rooms. This is because, in addition to not eating any *hametz* on Passover, we also may not even possess *hametz*. Accordingly, it is customary to "sell" our *hametz* to a non-Jew on *Erev Pesah*. Naturally, we also buy it back at the conclusion of the holiday. Anything "sold" in this manner becomes the nominal property of the purchaser during the holiday so that we do not own the *hametz* on our property. Rabbi Cantor will be glad to make the necessary arrangements for selling your *hametz*.

Please fill out the section below and return it to the synagogue office no later than **Tuesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>**. There is no charge for "selling" *hametz* on your behalf. However, it is customary to make a contribution (*ma'ot hittim*) to provide Passover necessities for those who are in need. Please make these checks payable to "The Kosher Food Pantry."
