initial	income derived from the fund "For the education of such boys and girls as in their judgment are
each	deserving, or said trustees may loan to deserving boys and girls, for the purpose of education, from the
box:	income of said trust, such sum or sums, as in the opinion of said trustees will be for the best interest of
	such boys and girls, hereby giving to said trustees the absolute power to select the persons to be
	educated, and the institutions of learning in which they are to receive said education."
1.	In order that a greater number of persons may be helped by the fund, and that independence may be
	created in the recipient, the money will be furnished in the form of a LOAN. No security will be
	required except <b>a note of honor</b> , and no interest will be charged. You should be sure to understand
	that <b>you are applying for an interest-free LOAN not a scholarship</b> . When you cease your
	education, whether or not you graduate, each month you are honor bound to repay 1% of the total
