Festival Clinicians

Kathryn Blocki is a nationally respected flute clinician, teaching at the National Flute Convention, flute festivals and colleges and universities across the country. She is also creator of the *Great Beginnings for the New Flutist* DVD, and patent holder for the Pneumo Pro Wind Director (a flute training tool). She has also studied Suzuki Flute, Kodaly, Orff and Dalcroze. She has performed as a member of the Fort Wayne Philharmonic, Chautauqua Festival



Orchestra, and a soloist with the American Wind Symphony and Elkhart Symphony. She graduated with high honors from IU Bloomington, highest honors from Arizona State University, and has had the privilege of studying with Eric Hoover, James Pellerite, Samuel Baron, and Bernard Goldberg. Currently, she serves as a member of the National Flute Association's Pedagogy Committee.

Rebecca Hovan teaches at Indiana University South Bend and Goshen College. She is a member of the National Flute Association and served as Chair of the Pedagogy Committee for five years. Rebecca is also co-author of several titles in the Blocki Flute Method series. As a performer, she appears regularly in recital and has appeared on programs at several conventions of the National Flute Association. She is a Conn-Selmer artist and has presented numerous pedagogy workshops throughout the United States.



She earned a M.M. from the University of North Texas where she studied with Mary Karen Clardy. Recent activities include recording her first CD, A Silver Christmas, and co-authoring Book III in the Blocki Flute Method series, due for release in August, 2011.

Sherry Kujala maintains a career that balances her interests in flute performance, publishing, and arts administration. She received her B.M. from Baylor University where she was a student of Helen Ann Shanley. She completed her M.M. in flute performance at Northwestern University. Upon graduation, she won a spot in the Civic Orchestra of Chicago and took a staff position with the Chicago Symphony. Kujala also studied at Northwestern's Kellogg Graduate School of Management. She has performed with orchestras throughout the Midwest, and is currently active in orchestras in Illinois, Wisconsin and Michigan.



Kujala and her husband Walfrid Kujala own Progress Press, a publishing firm devoted to pedagogical materials for flute study and orchestra audition preparation.

Stacey Graham Steele is Assistant Professor of Music at Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania where she was awarded the 2007 Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching. She earned her B.M.E. from Wichita State University and a M.M. in Flute Performance from the University of North Texas where she studied with Mary Karen



Clardy and Sue Calebaugh. Ms. Steele performs frequently in solo and chamber music recitals and has performed as a soloist for numerous national and international conferences. She is Chair of the National Flute Association Pedagogy Committee and has appeared at NFA Conventions on numerous occasions as a soloist, conductor and presenter, including conducting the 2006 NFA National High School Flute Choir.

Driving Directions to IU South Bend


