Grants Have Positive Impact On Communities

Over the past 28 years, the York Community Foundation has awarded more than \$2.5 million in grants and close to \$1.6 million in scholarships. These grants and scholarships provide untold benefits to communities and individuals. Frequently, the Foundation receives acknowledgements of appreciation from grant and scholarship recipients. The Foundation would like to share with you a few of the appreciative comments from our very deserving recipients. We hope this gives a glimpse of the positive impact these grants have made on our communities.

York College has received funding for a variety of projects throughout their campus. Brent Magner, Vice-President of Advancement at York College stated that: *"In every project, the York Community Foundation has served as a partner who asks important questions and provides essential support for the mission of York College and the students we serve."*



Lucile Mincks very generously gave a portion of her estate to the Foundation for youth projects. The Village of Benedict received grant funding from the Mincks funds for playground equipment and improvements to their community center.

According to Kelly Brooke, Village Clerk, *"The Park/Playground and Community Center are the central part of our Community. Many family, community, and school events are held here. The community of Benedict and the surrounding areas have benefitted greatly from the generosity of Lucile Mincks."*

Cultural and fine arts programs are eligible for funding from the Foundation.

These programs play an important role in the community. Don Keelan-White, Former President York Public Schools Fine Arts Booster Club, said: *"I have witnessed the philanthropic bigheartedness of the YCF as the Fine Arts Boosters sought funds for a number of projects including a new piano for the elementary school, new choir robes for the high school, and two follow-spots for the YHS theater, just to name a few."*



The York Adopt-A-Pet animal shelter provides an important service to the community and rescues more than 700 dogs and cats annually. *"The grant money received enables York Adopt-A-Pet to continue its mission in the future"*, said Charlie Sanders, President, York Adopt-A-Pet Board of Directors. The Foundation provided financial assistance to YAAP to help pay down the USDA loan for the new shelter, and also

provided funds for landscaping from the Dorothy and Howard May Beautification Fund.

Through the generosity of people in the York community, the Foundation is able to meet many needs in our community that may otherwise go unmet. Garold Leggott, a Foundation board member, said: *"I have a whole new appreciation for the many lives and projects that these generous funds touch each year. WESSELS LIVING HISTORY FARM UPDATE

Preserve the history and tell the story of Nebraska agriculture and farm life. That is the mission of the Wessels Living History Farm, and that is exactly what is happening! In 2012, Heritage Nebraska awarded the Farm the honor of being a "Destination Place" a "must see" site in offering tourist experiences, services and opportunities to tell the story of local, regional or state history. The Nebraska Tourism Commission once again selected the Farm as a "Passport Destination."

These honors continue to be testimonials to the dedicated team spirit of the Board of Directors, staff and many volunteers. Over 60 volunteers from York and surrounding communities generously gave of their time and talents. They gave tours, made repairs, cleaned, mowed, tended gardens, built exhibits, provided living history demonstrations and assisted with educational classes and special events.

The enthusiasm and financial support of the York community and surrounding areas have been vital in the development of the Farm. Generous individual donors and the York Community Visitor Bureau enabled us to build a new porch for the farm house and a restroom near the barn. The new restroom which includes a small dressing room/gift shop will accommodate our guests for special events and rental facilities for weddings, tour groups, club activities, family reunions, birthday parties and school groups.

We at Wessels continually strive to expand and improve our exhibits. A new interactive exhibit (complete with QR codes) in the granary leads the visitor through the history of producing a corn crop. Outside the granary a small check-planted cornfield complete with planter and check wire affords the visitor an example of how corn was in planted in 42 inches apart in the 1920s. Numerous other donated items have been added to our collections by generous donors in the community as well as other states.

A compelling program of classes, tours, rental opportunities and special events attracted thousands of participants from all 50 states and 30 countries to the Wessels Living History Farm. Special events included: Family Fun Day, Model- T Touring Day, Living History Day, Yorkshire Playhouse melodrama "Avarice in Ambrosia," Tractor, Engine & Auto Show," a Barn Dance,

and Boo on the Farm. Christmas on the Farm (December 8 through the 23 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.) will be the culminating event.

The Farm site continues to be complemented by the virtual Web site (www.livinghistoryfarm.org).

It guides visitors to the Farm site and provides them with in-depth history and video interviews from those who lived the history. Bill Ganzel's research, interviewing skills and dedication to historical accuracy make the Web site a great resource and source of pride.

The officers of the Board of Directors are: Elaine Stuhr, President; Barbara Shelden, Vice-President; James Conner, Treasurer and Richard Hankel, Secretary.

Others serving on the board are Kendell Holthus, Kenneth Klepper, Robert Sautter Joan Strong, and Gary Zoubek. The members of this Board have contributed countless hours of their time, expertise, and responsible leadership. They are the foundation upon which David Wessels Dream continues to evolve.

Grants Committee

The Grants Committee is responsible for reviewing grant applications and making recommendations to the Foundation Board of Directors, in accordance with the wishes of the donor, as to which grant applications should be approved. The Grants Committee meets periodically. A grant application is available to download online, and the Foundation office will provide additional information.

Eligibility Requirements

The York Community Foundation awards grants to both private and public services. The grants are made only to agencies classified as:

- 501(c) (3) by the Internal Revenue Service
- government agencies using the grant for capital expenditures and/or capital improvements.

Applicants must have a plan for future funding and support from other sources if funding is for an ongoing program.

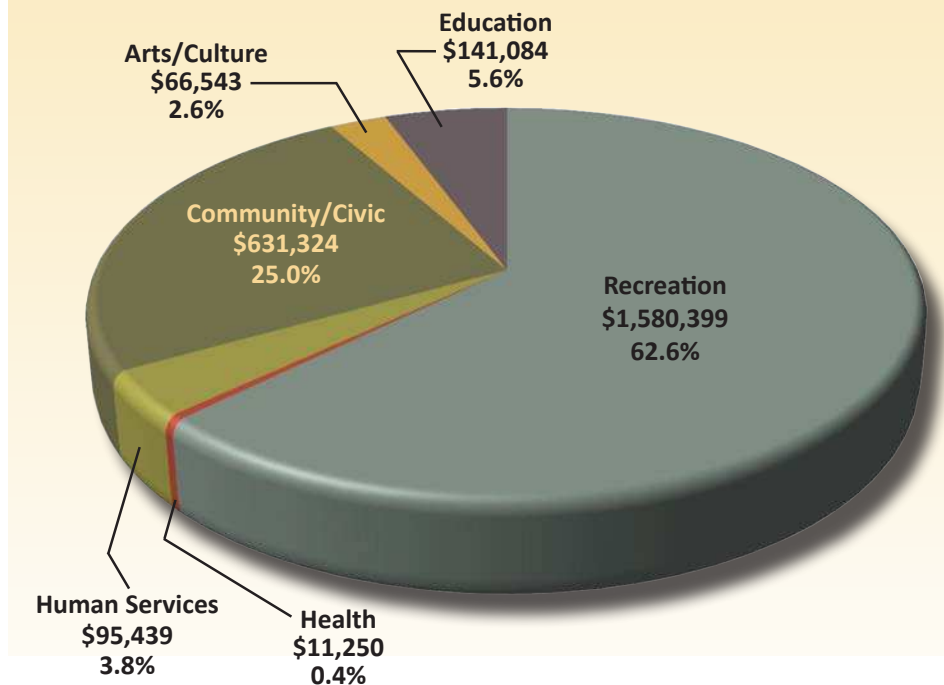

Scholarships

General Information — The York Community Foundation currently administers twenty seven scholarship funds. The Foundation awards over \$50,000 in scholarships annually to students in the York area. The Foundation scholarship program consists of separate scholarship funds created by individuals, families or organizations who wish to provide opportunities to students to further their education. The donors have established criteria for the administration of their scholarships. The criteria are consistent with the Foundation's scholarship policy.

Scholarship Applications — Nearly all scholarship applications and supporting documents can be downloaded online. Application deadlines appear on the applications. If paper copies of the scholarship applications are needed, they may be obtained from high school guidance counselors.

- **Arthur H. & Belle L. Merrill Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to pursue a degree in education.
- **Jason Barrett Memorial Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School, who is involved in high school athletics, and plans to attend a vocational school.
- **Beth Ellis Memorial Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior girl at York High School who has participated in at least two high school sports.
- **Steve Block Memorial Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to pursue enrollment in industrial technology, architecture or engineering.
- **Lance J. Boyle Memorial Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who is a member of the York Chapter of FFA and plans to attend a technical school and pursue a degree in agriculture.
- **Raymond "Butch" Gray Memorial Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to attend a technical school in Nebraska and major in welding, metal fabrication or machining.
- **Kathleen Dougherty-Bartzal Scholarship** - one \$6,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to major in a field related to the environmental sciences. If no one applies in the field of conservation and natural resources, the scholarship will be open to a student going into the field of education.
- **Harold Elkins Memorial Golf Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior boy at York High School who is a member of the York High School golf team.
- **R.A. & Lena Freeman Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to attend a technical school and major in a field related to foundry work.
- **Alfred & Verna Holthus Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at Bertrand High School.
- **Holthus Family Scholarship** - \$1,000 scholarships are available to current graduating seniors at York High School. The number of scholarships available may vary.
- **Vivian Hoyle Nursing Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to major in nursing.
- **JoDelle A. Obermier Memorial Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior who attends a York County High School or attends Cross County High School and resides in York County.
- **Kenneth C. & Joyce H. Rhoades Memorial Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to pursue a degree in elementary education or agriculture.
- **Levitt Family Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to attend a public or private Nebraska technical school or college.
- **Loren A. & Erma E. Pieper Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to pursue a degree in plumbing/heating/air conditioning.
- **Maurie Van Nostrand Memorial Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at Cross County High School who resides in York County.
- **Peterson Family Scholarship** - one \$500 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at Cross County High School who resides in York County.
- **Ray Korbek Memorial Scholarship** - one \$1,000 scholarship is available to a current graduating senior at York High School who plans to attend a technical school with a building emphasis.
- **Winsor Tucker Scholarship** - the number and amount of scholarships vary. Scholarships are available to current graduating seniors who attend a York County School or any other school district that includes York County property. The applicant must reside in York County. Scholarships are renewable for four years. This scholarship has a separate application and supporting documents.

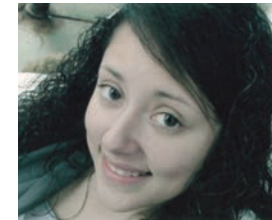

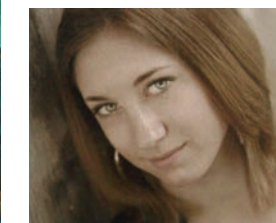
