Application for Permit (registration) to Drill and Produce Water

Why am I required to obtain a water well drilling permit?

Pursuant to Texas Water Code 36.113, all new or modified existing water wells in Rusk County <u>must</u> be approved in writing by the Rusk County Groundwater Conservation District prior to drilling. Additional reasons for your Groundwater Conservation District to require a drilling permit are: Insure that the District maintains accurate water use information for the District; Allow the District to perform its mission of protecting and preserving the underground water resources within the District boundaries; Insure that the new or modified well will not result in overlapping cones of depression and water waste through improper spacing.

This Application for Permit to Drill and Produce Water may be mailed or delivered in person to the District offices. The District staff shall review the form and make a preliminary determination on the compliance of the proposed water well with the District Rules and respond to the applicant within 5 working days. If the proposed well meets the requirements of the District Rules, a Drilling permit number will be issued and drilling may commence. If the preliminary determination indicates that the new well does not meet the requirements of the District Rules, a hearing will be scheduled within 10 days to allow the Board of Directors to make a final determination on the acceptability of the request. Notification of the time and place of this hearing will be conveyed to the applicant within 5 working days of receipt of this application. The drilling of a new well is at your own risk and subject to the rules of the District. It is a violation of the District Rules for a well owner, well operator, or water well driller to drill any well without an approved Application for Permit to Drill and Produce Water.

THIS APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED WITH THE PERMIT FEE OF \$125.00.

(\$100.00 of this fee will be returned to the applicant after a completed application for water well registration is received by the District within 14 days of completion of the well.)
