The Temporary Authorization allows a third-party representative to view an employer's information regarding payroll, claims and experience modification.

Attention Private Employer Group-Rating Prospects:

- Employer may complete the AC-3 for as many TPA or group rating sponsors as they feel are necessary to obtain quotes for a group-rating program.
- Group sponsors must notify all current group members who have made application for the next group-rating year if they will not be accepted. The deadline for this notification is December 1st of each year.
- All potential group rating prospects must have:
 - Active BWC coverage status as of the application deadline;
 - Active coverage from the application deadline through the group- rating year; No outstanding balances;
 - Operations similar in nature to the other members of their group.
- Any changes to a group member's policy will affect the group policy. Changes can result in either debits or credits to each of the members.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

SUBSTANCE ABUSE TESTING AND WORKPLACE INJURIES

- THE FORGOTTEN STEP -

If an employee tests positive for drugs or alcohol immediately after a workplace injury, that employee won't receive workers' comp benefits, correct? While this seems like a simple question, the answer is so complicated that the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation does not even seem to have a straight answer. The answer is "it depends!" The Bureau's Drug-Free Workplace Program was specifically created to eradicate substance abuse problems at Ohio's workplaces but it does not automatically increase an employer's chances of winning a comp hearing against an abuser. Read on and learn the missing step that will help you win your next case.

Ohio's Drug-Free Workplace Program was designed to lower workers' compensation costs by creating a work environment free from the effects of drug and alcohol abuse and by penalizing employees for abuse. Users are three to four times more likely to have a job accident and five times more likely to file a comp claim. The Program offers state-fund employers various levels of premium discounts for establishing substance abuse programs which include components of education and testing. The Program also helps avoid an employer's high costs associated with accidents and injuries caused by employees under the influence of drugs or alcohol. While participation in the DFWP for most employers is voluntary, construction contractors are required to have a drug-free workplace program to bid on or work a state-administered construction contract/project.

Ohio employers participating in the Program are required to test employees involved in most workplace accidents for drugs and alcohol. After an accident or injury, most employers automatically implement the policy and send an employee for testing. The test occurs simply as a matter of policy. However, many Ohio employers are skipping a step which could increase their chances of preventing that undeserving employee from receiving comp benefits.

In order to be entitled to what is known as the "rebuttable presumption," a presumption that shifts the burden of proof to the employee to prove that the alcohol or drugs in their system was **not** the cause of the injury, employers must also show that "reasonable cause" existed for the test in the first place. "Reasonable cause" is

necessary even though the Bureau's own Drug-Free Workplace Program requires the test. The accident or injury is not sufficient "reasonable cause" by itself. But, if these things are shown, the benefits customarily are denied.

The Bureau's Guide specifically states that the "quality of documentation of reasonable cause is essential in having [the] rebuttable presumption considered." The Bureau even requires "reasonable cause" if an employee refuses to take a test after an accident. Therefore, before throwing away your chances of denying workers' compensation benefits to an employee who abuses drugs or alcohol and causes an accident or injury, make sure you document (after the accident and at the time you request the employee to take the test) the reasons which support your belief that the employee could be under the influence of drugs or alcohol. "Reasonable cause" can include such things as staggering, slurred speech, argumentative or drowsy behavior or bloodshot eyes. Each circumstance can vary greatly and any and all observations which could support "reasonable cause" should be well documented at the time the employee is asked to submit to the test.







INDUSTRY GROUPS RELEASE CONSENSUSDOCS

Washington D.C.—On Friday, September 28, a diverse group of 20 construction associations representing designers, owners, contractors, subcontractors and sureties will launch ConsensusDOCS, with more than 70 collaboratively drafted construction contracts.

The release of ConsensusDOCS represents the first time that broad industry representation has had an equal voice in collaboratively drafting construction contracts. The unprecedented buy-in for these contracts reflects a genuine effort to identify and employ best practices to better the industry.

"The release of ConsensusDOCS is one of the most significant industry developments in the last 20 years," said Stephen E. Sandherr, chief executive officer of the Associated General Contractors of America (AGC). "We believe this effort will positively transform the industry's use of standard contract documents."

Consensus DOCS is unique because each document was drafted to reflect the project's best interests, rather than a single party interest. These documents help parties to focus on better project results, rather than negotiating risk-shifting contract terms or worse, contract claims in court, to assess fault.

"The best practices of the 2007 ConsensusDOCS establish a new 'gold standard' for defining contractual relationships in design and construction projects," said E. Colette Nelson, executive vice president of the American Subcontractors Association Inc. (ASA). "These documents encourage practices that are in the best interest of all parties to a project rather than merely reflecting existing unfair business practices and industry trends."

There are more than 70 Documents that address all project delivery methods, from design-bid-build through a new innovative collaborative agreement (ConsensusDOCS 300). These cutting-edge contracts and forms help address emerging issues such as electronic communications and building information modeling (ConsensusDOCS 200.2).

Owner involvement was an integral part of the drafting process. "We are pleased to have supported and endorsed this valiant industry effort," noted Greg Sizemore, Executive Vice President of the Construction Users Roundtable (CURT). "For once the industry has come together in a truly collaborative way to create value for all the stakeholders." Industry owners were able to hear the concerns of all construction parties and this helped to better allocate risk to the most appropriate parties. Richard A. Foss, Executive Vice President of the National Association of the Surety Bond Producers (NASBP) remarked, "NASBP views ConsensusDOCS as a proactive, positive initiative to benefit the construction industry by fostering an equitable apportionment of risk among project participants through the development and publication of fair and balanced standardized form contracts."

The broad industry involvement helped to shape contracts that represent the best interests of the project. The documents represent discussions by each group on appropriate risk sharing and other issues.

"COAA is happy to be part of the industry collaboration which ultimately became ConsensusDOCS," added Jack Mumma, president of Construction Owners Association of America (COAA). "We recognize that when it comes to contract documents, there's no such thing as one size fits all."

"I am really anxious to see this collaborative effort produce an even-handed family of documents that all segments of the construction industry agree is balanced," commented Dudley Miles, past president of Associated Specialty Contractors, Inc., (ASC.)

In an effort to provide their Employers with qualified people from their first day on the job, the Sheet Metal Contractors Association (Association) and the Sheet Metal Workers Local No. 24 (SMWIA) Joint Apprenticeship Committee (JAC) are requiring that all applicants that enter the apprenticeship program complete mandatory training classes.

The classes were completed in August and include OSHA 10 hour certification; industrial truck certification; scissor lift certification; and Drug and Alcohol Free Workplace Training. There is also a general orientation to the shop and field practices.

MCAGD UPGRADES WELDER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

The Mechanical Contractors Association of Greater Dayton (MCAGD) in conjunction with United Association of Plumbers and Pipe Fitters Local No. 162 (UA162) have implemented upgrades to their welder certification program that saves the contractor dollars and provides a welder the ability to carry welder qualifications under numerous procedures, thereby efficiently meeting customer needs to comply with ASME, the Ohio Division of Pressure Piping, and other welding standards.

This program establishes a clear record of welder qualification; welder continuity; and procedure qualifications. The cost savings occurs in he fact that all MCAGD Members Firms have agreed to use this process as a group, thereby eliminating the need for welders to test multiple times in order to maintain a welder qualification.

MCAGD and UA162 feel that this process will provide consumers of their services the assurances that they need as it relates to certified welding.

MCAGD and UA162 have established a Welding Advisory Board to monitor this program. The Board Members are Jack Edwards, Jr. of Rieck Services; Jim Baker, UA Welding Coordinator; Glenn Fischer of Fischer Engineering serving as the Board's Consultant; and Rachel Pinkus, Staff Coordinator for MCAGD. Jim Beasely of S&D Osterfeld recently retired from the Board. Jim has a vast knowledge of welding and still makes himself available and provides input to the Board as well.

OSFC ANNOUNCES "GREEN SCHOOLS" INITIATIVE

Hundreds of new and renovated schools are set to meet higher energy efficiency and environmental standards, according to the Ohio School Facilities Commission.

At its meeting September 27, the Commission adopted the LEED for Schools Rating System as part of its school design standards. Created by the non-profit U.S. Green Building Council, LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) is a widely used benchmark for the design and construction of energy efficient and environmentally conscious buildings. To qualify for the LEED for Schools designation, individual buildings must meet specifications for land use, water and energy efficiency, construction materials, and indoor air quality. LEED serves as a design guideline for green buildings and offers third party validation of a building's green features.

With \$4.1 billion targeted for school facilities under Governor Strickland's Tobacco Securitization plan, the Commission's action means that at least 250 buildings will be registering for LEED Silver Certification within the next two years.

OSFC Executive Director Michael C. Shoemaker noted, "The LEED criteria have been shown to have a positive effect on student health, attendance, and performance. While the state is sharing in the cost of the upfront construction, the benefits – including energy savings – accrue directly to the school districts participating in our programs."

LEED certification has four progressive levels – Certified, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. The level of certification depends on the number of criteria that are met during the design and construction of a building. Under the Commission's green schools initiative, all future OSFC-funded buildings will be encouraged to meet LEED for Schools Gold certification. There is a minimum requirement to meet LEED Silver certification with a preferred investment in attaining Gold level points in the energy and atmosphere category.

In addition to adopting the new standard, Commissioners also asked Director Shoemaker to form a task force to explore options for state financing that would assist school districts in funding the local share of the cost.
