HFH of Mariposa County begins its 7th Year!

Habitat for Humanity of Mariposa County is beginning its seventh year as an affiliate of Habitat International. The affiliate has received great support from our community and county. Habitat's work is funded by individual and church donations; grants from partners such as PG&E, State Farm, Home Depot, Whirlpool and others; and Habitat International programs, such as Cars for Homes.

The Tour de Habitat draws nearly 100 riders for our stationary bike competition and casual riding each year. Generally, sixteen teams bring us from \$300 to \$1,500 each, and this year the ride, raffle, and sponsorships raised around \$11,500.

The vast majority of Habitat's donations go directly to home building. Our board of directors decided early in our affiliation to accept the Habitat International policy of tithing 10% of our undesignated donations. Due to this policy, HFH of Mariposa County has built **five homes** through Habitat International's Global Village program in countries where the need is greatest: Southeast Asia or Haiti, for example. Homes in these countries may be built for \$3-\$5,000.

Howard and Joy Dudley of Garden Grove, California, have been wonderful benefactors of HFH of MC. They have generously donated two 5-acre parcels on Sebastopol Road for partner family homes. The Sternberg home on Sebastopol was dedicated in August 2011. The Ruaisabs, HFH of MC's second partners, have been in their home on Mueller Court since its dedication on November 11, 2013.

HFH of MC was the recipient of another large donation at the end of 2013 when a home was donated anonymously to the affiliate. Because the home was not suitable for a Habitat home, HFH of MC was able to sell it, with the donor's permission. It sold very quickly and, for that reason, Habitat has unexpected funds for building and is looking forward to selecting its third partner family very soon! (See article In this newsletter.)

Those of us working for Habitat, all volunteers, count our blessings and thank all our hard workers and kind supporters for getting us this far in fulfilling our mission to bring safe, decent, affordable housing to our county.

We will be starting our search for our third partner family on Saturday May 10th, 2014. If you have friends or family who are currently living in substandard housing and are in need of safe, decent, affordable housing please let them know about this important meeting. Our Family Information Meeting will be held at the Mariposa Lutheran Church at 11:00 AM on Saturday, May 10th. Applications for our home ownership program, along with an informative presentation covering all aspects of the application process, will be covered during this meeting. Application packets are only available at this event. Please come join us.

HFH of Mariposa County is working on its 6th A Brush With Kindness project

This program is designed in particular to help elderly and disabled homeowners maintain their homes, especially with yard cleanup and exterior painting. Others may apply for the program.

In the past, HFH of MC has completed five yard cleanups, installed rain gutters on one home, and repaired fences on two homes in Mariposa County. Families or individuals may apply for the program and be accepted on the basis of need, willingness to partner with Habitat which includes putting in some type of "sweat equity," if possible, and qualifying on a financial basis.

Like our home-building program, families are asked to pay back all or part of the expenses, and that money is used in future projects. This may be done in small amounts over time. Habitat maintains its policy of a "hand up" rather than a "handout."

Bruce Pickard is the new chair of Habitat's *A Brush With Kindness* program. Habitat is always looking for volunteers to help in these short term projects. Call 966-7444 if you are interested.



Cars for Homes Update



Habitat for Humanity of Mariposa County recognizes the latest Cars for Homes donors, Bob and Yvonne McKnight, for their generous donation of their 2001 Toyota Sienna minivan. The McKnights join a long list of donors from Mariposa County who have brought \$22,926.63 to Habitat's work since we began in 2008. This amount would have paid for almost a quarter of the expenses on the partner family home on Mueller Court, including trusses, roofing, lumber, drywall, and cabinets.

The McKnights donated their car on Friday, February 28, and it was picked up on Monday, March 3! Although Habitat International administers the program, our local affiliate receives 80% of the proceeds. In this way, cars are turned into homes for deserving families who help to build them and pay back a no-interest mortgage loan to Habitat for future homes.




