

About these courses

The HVACR industry has been using HCFCs since the 1940s. Today, due to environmental and competitive pressure, equipment that uses HCFCs (including R-22) is being phased out, and replaced by equipment that uses HFC R-410A, marketed under the brand names Honeywell AZ-20, Carrier Puron, and DuPont Suva. This R-410A Safety Certification class comes from a universal curriculum developed by the HVACR industry. It prepares you to safely repair or change out old systems, and prepares you to pass the R-410A certification exam.

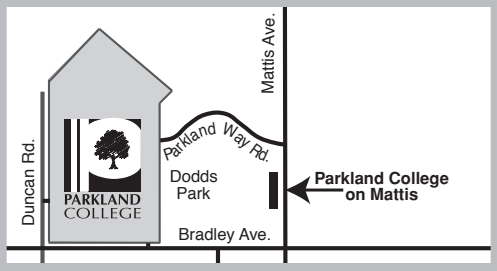
Section 608 of the Federal Clean Air Act requires that persons who work with regulated refrigerants be certified. The EPA Section 608 class will prepare you to pass the certification exam to keep your credentials in compliance.

EPA Section 608 Certification Review Session and Testing

R-410A Safety Certification Review Session and Testing

HVACR service personnel need to know the facts to keep safe. The EPA established the phase out of HCFC R-22 with no production or importing beginning in 2020. However, equipment manufacturers were required to phase out the use of HCFC R-22 in new units by January 1, 2010. Prepare for R-410A Safety Certification with **Bruce Hinman**. During the morning session, Bruce will review safe handling, proper charging, operating characteristics, proper applications, and general use of R-410A refrigerant. In the afternoon, he will administer the test. Once you complete and pass the exam, you will receive an EPA-approved certification card from ESCO Institute.

To prepare for the R-410A Safety Certification, participants are encouraged to pick up the manual prior to the review and testing session.

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RESIDENCY INFORMATION
