New Scholarship at Parkland College

David J. Sulzbach, President & Chief Operating Officer of Clifford-Jacobs Forging Company, Inc., announced the establishment of the "Clifford-Jacobs Scholarship" at Parkland College. The Scholarship is being established in honor of W.E.C. "Cass" Clifford and his partner, David B. Jacobs, who formed a partnership in December 1919 that created Clifford-Jacobs Forging Company.

The Scholarship will be in the amount \$2,500 annually (\$1,250 per semester) and is intended for students enrolled in the Industrial Technology program at Parkland College. Recipients shall have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given if a student is related to a Clifford-Jacobs family member or employee or who is a direct descendant of same. "We recognize the vital mission that Parkland College is fulfilling in its Industrial Technology program, as we have several employees who either are currently enrolled and/or who have successfully completed that program, and who are making an outstanding contribution to our ongoing success," Sulzbach commented. "We believe this is a wonderful way in which to honor the founders of our company by establishing a scholarship at an outstanding institution that succeeds in their mission of preparing students for real-life careers, and to give

ICCTA 2006 Outstanding Faculty Member

David Bock, Program Director of Computer Graphics and Associate Professor in Computer Science has been named as Parkland's 2006 Illinois Community College Trustees Association Outstanding Faculty Member. David was recognized at the ICCTA awards banquet in Springfield on June 9.

2006 Terry O'Banion Shared Journey Exemplary Practice Award

In a national competition, Parkland College was chosen as one of five community colleges to receive the 2006 Terry O'Banion Shared Journey Exemplary Practice Award given by the National Council on Student Development, an affiliate council of the American Association of Community Colleges.

This award celebrates the outstanding nature of a program that fosters the aims of student development in community colleges. Programs are deemed outstanding because they are highly innovative and a model of best practices in the field, and because the evidence of effectiveness includes compelling data that has been demonstrated over time.

Linda Moore, Dean of Student Services and **Sharon Kristovich**, Director of the Office of Institutional Research, Evaluation, and Planning submitted the work that Parkland has done in The Academic Development Center and on Campus-wide Retention Efforts. According to Linda Moore, Parkland was recognized as outstanding for two reasons. "Parkland's efforts to ensure student success have been college-wide, involving collaborative and innovative efforts among multiple academic and student services departments. The other reason is that we have systematic evaluation plans in place, and have data indicating the effectiveness of our programs."

2006 IMACC Distinguished Service Award

Vicki Beitler, of the Parkland Mathematics Department, has received the 2006 Illinois Mathematics Association of Community Colleges Distinguished Service Award. This annual award honors one of its members for career of outstanding service to the IMACC. The recipient must have been an IMACC member for at least 10 years, have served in an elected office, and have served at least 4 years in some combinations of elected offices, committee appointments, as conference coordinator, or as editor of the Math ConneXion.

Vicki has served three years on the Board of Directors, has served as conference coordinator or co-coordinator 6 times, and has just completed her eleventh consecutive year as IMACC Secretary.

Skills USA

Students from the Automotive Collision Repair program went to Springfield, Illinois, to compete in the Skills USA competition. Four of the top five awards went to Parkland students. In fifth place was **Jesse Ferguson**, fourth place was **Justin Slife**, second place was **Mike Johnson**, and first place was **Keith Heinzelman**. The first place winner from each state will go to the national competition in Kansas City, Missouri.
